SB 56 (Deferred from 7<sup>th</sup> LD) permit the operation of a Class I electric bicycle on the

Mickelson Trail. (Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Engrossed)

SB 57	create uniform procedures for consideration of criminal histories and convictions in professional or occupational licensure. (Introduced)
SB 71	(Deferred from 7 <sup>th</sup> LD) remove a prohibition on the ability of law enforcement and various governmental entities to inspect, search, seize, prosecute, or impose disciplinary action on cannabis dispensaries, cultivation facilities, manufacturing facilities, and testing facilities. (Introduced)
SB 73	(Removed from Consent Calendar) provide that the presiding officer of the Senate is required to sign each enrolled bill. (Introduced)
SB 78	(Deferred from 7 <sup>th</sup> LD) provide for an E15 fuel tax refund. (Senate Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
SJR 502	Providing legislative approval for a future use water permit application by the Lewis and Clark Regional Water System. (Introduced)
