- Providing outreach concerning its program services to the American people generally, and to disabled veterans and their families specifically.

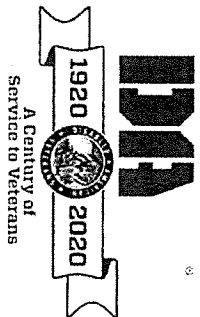
- Representing the interests of disabled veterans, their families, their widowed spouses and their orphans before Congress, the White House and the Judicial Branch, as well as state and local government.

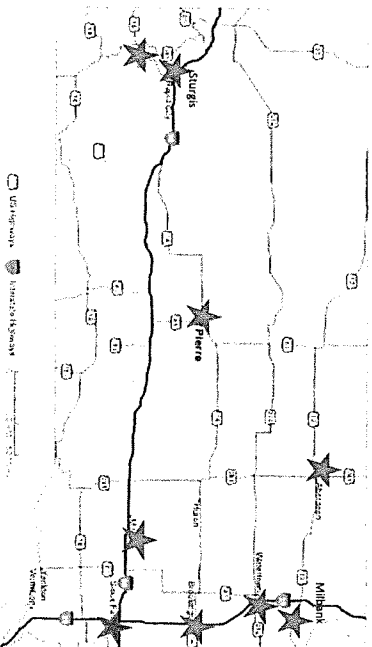

2024 LEGISLATIVE ENDORSEMENTS

The DAV adopted these legislative issues at the 2023 Fall Conference. DAV members ask their district legislators to sponsor and support these legislative endorsements.

1. An Act to support Reinstatement of Grants for the DAV Hospital Transportation Network from South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs.
2. An act to support the construction of an east side state Veterans home in South Dakota, and to declare an emergency.

3. An Act to research placement of Veterans in community nursing homes, assisted living services, Medical Foster Home Programs, and VA Home Health Program with funding from federal and state governments and Veterans in rural states.

4. An Act to revise certain provisions relating to the Veterans' preference in employment (Public, State, Counties, Municipalities, and School Districts).
5. An Act to exempt 100% Disabled Veterans from paying sales tax on the first \$25,000.00 in purchases each year.

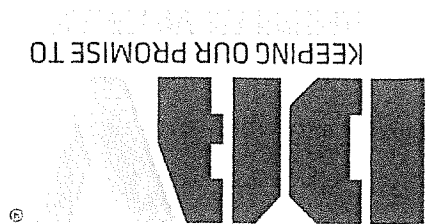
6. An Act to support that eligibility for admission to the State Veterans' Home the Veteran must have served active duty (Training doesn't count as active duty).
7. An Act to support keeping the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Residential Rehabilitation Treatment Program in Hot Springs and Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) in Ft. Meade.

8. An Act to support Exemption of Veteran's disability payments from income calculations from certain tax relief programs.

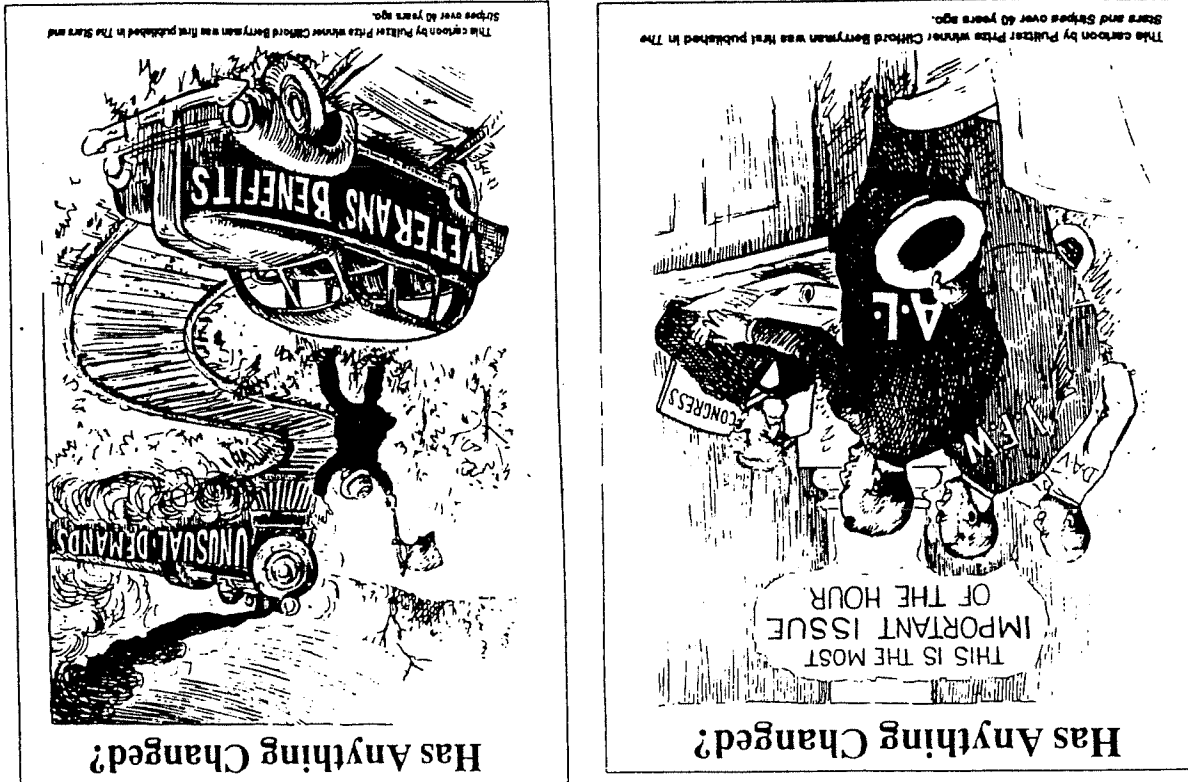
9. An Act to support Military Absentee Voting.

10. An Act to support the salary supplement to County/Tribal Veterans Service Officers.
10. An Act to permit voters to register on Election Day at the polling place.

11. An Act to make an appropriation to provide certain refunds on sales tax on food.



12. An Act to support the specific amount of money that is appropriated from the budget to operate the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs, Michael J. Fitzmaurice South Dakota Veterans Home, and South Dakota State Veterans Cemetery.
13. An Act to support Veterans entitled to free tuition at state institutions or any post-secondary technical institute.
14. An Act to change the eligibility requirements of a property tax relief program for disabled veterans and surviving spouses.
15. An Act to revise the eligible disability level for veterans to receive state park benefits.
16. An act to support reduction of property tax for disabled Veterans.
17. An Act to support collaboration between Department of GFP and mental health funding to provide outdoor, hunting, and fishing opportunities to disabled Veterans.

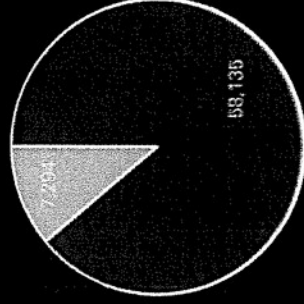
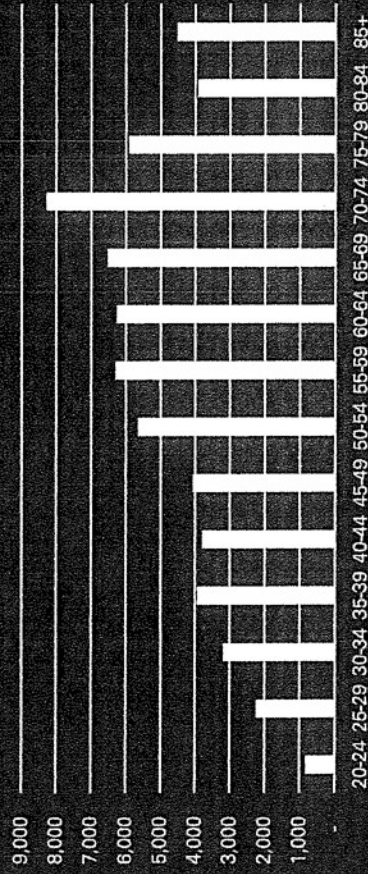

Who We Served

There are 941 living World War II Veterans in South Dakota.

There are 3,869 living Korean War-era Veterans in South Dakota, who served from 1950 to 1955.

There are 22,104 living Vietnam-era Veterans in South Dakota, who served from 1961 to 1975. SDDVA has seen an increase in disability claims filed on behalf of Vietnam Veterans due to the manifestation of acute diseases brought on by exposure to Agent Orange.

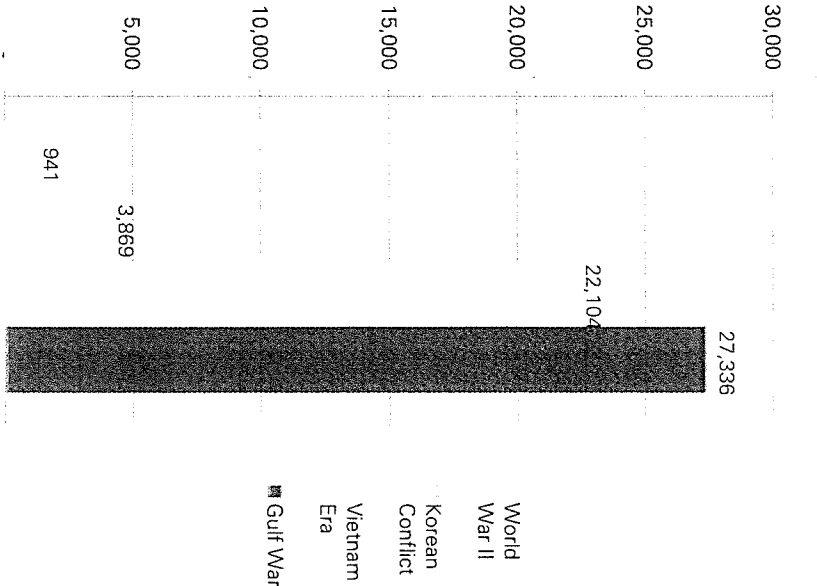
There are 27,336 living Gulf War-Era and pre-9/11 Veterans in South Dakota.

There are 10,946 living post-9/11 Veterans in South Dakota. Our returning veterans, much like the Greatest Generation of World War II, are seeking employment, housing, and education opportunities for themselves, their spouses and families.

There are 13,321 living Peacetime Veterans in South Dakota. They served honorably during a unique and relatively conflict-free time in our history.

Who We Served in 2022



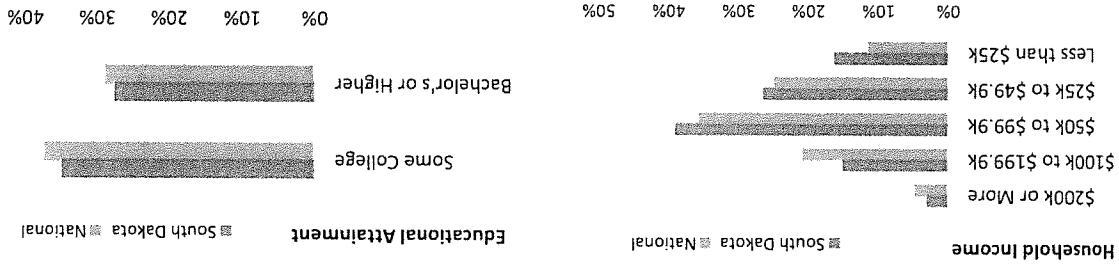
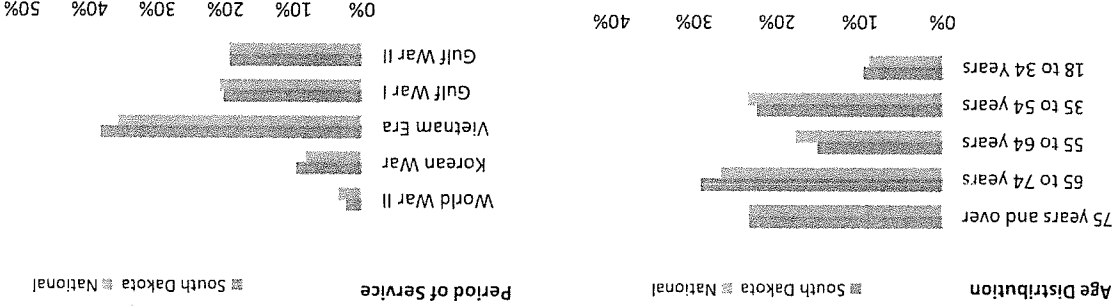

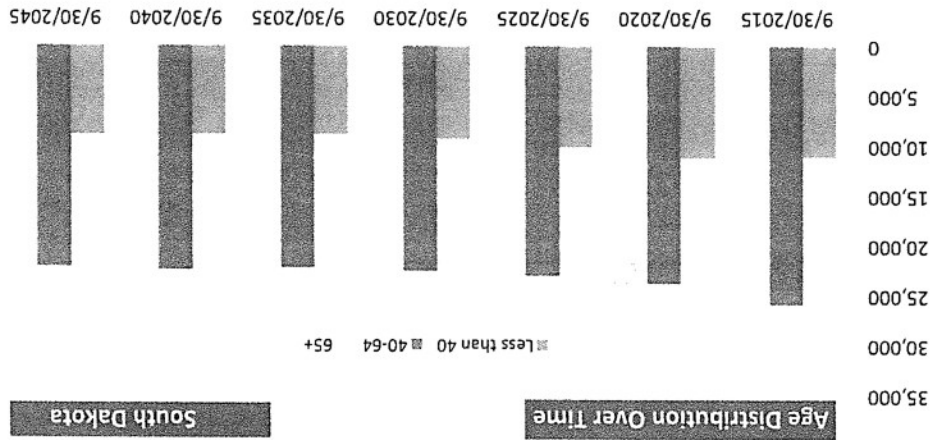

The Disabled American Veterans (DAV) Hospital Transportation Network is the only way many veterans are able to get to a VA medical facility for necessary treatment. Many of the veterans who use this program are seeking care for their service-connected disabilities. Others have limited resources, are too sick to drive, or may have no access to public transportation. The DAV Hospital Transportation Network is a clear example of veterans helping veterans. The DAV stepped in to meet a substantial community need, in this case termination of a federal program that helped many veterans pay for transportation to VA medical facilities.

The DAV has 190 Hospital Service Coordinators (HSCs) in nearly all VA medical facilities to run the DAV Hospital Transportation Network locally to provide FREE rides for our veterans.

We are enormously proud, as the DAV Hospital Transportation Network was started in Sioux Falls in 1984 and was picked up in 1987 as a DAV National Program. Currently we have twenty-six (26) vehicles in South Dakota with locations: Aberdeen, Belle Fourche, Brookings, Huron, Lake Andes, Madison, Miller, Mitchell, Mobridge, Pierre, Rapid City (3 vans), Redfield, Rosebud, Sioux Falls (4 vans), Sisseton, Sturgis, Yankton, Watertown (2 vans), Webster, and Winner. In FY 2022-2023 (July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023) the DAV Department of South Dakota was able to purchase one (1) 2023 XLT Ford Explorer. The new vehicle is for Winner and is currently being delivered to its new destination.

The total cost of the vehicle is \$40,282.00 with the American Legion Clem Mortenson Post 169 of Winner paying \$22,155.00. The DAV wishes to thank all who have donated for the purchase of the vehicle to support our Veterans.

The DAV Department provided salaries of \$70,757.03 and other expenses of \$12,797.13 to operate the DAV Hospital Transportation Network in FY 2022-2023.

In FY 2022-2023 (July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023) the DAV Hospital Transportation Network transported 3,020 Veterans, the volunteer drivers provided 12,013 hours and have driven 182,608 miles. **VOLUNTEER DRIVERS = "SUPER JOB FOR OUR HEROES - OUR VETERANS!"**

Since 1987 the statistics are: 89 vehicles have been purchased by the DAV in South Dakota, 433,980 Veterans Transported, 860,464 Volunteer Hours, and 19,959,193 Miles Driven.

When vehicles obtain 150,000 to 200,000 miles, we purchase new vehicles to make sure the vehicles are safe for our veterans.

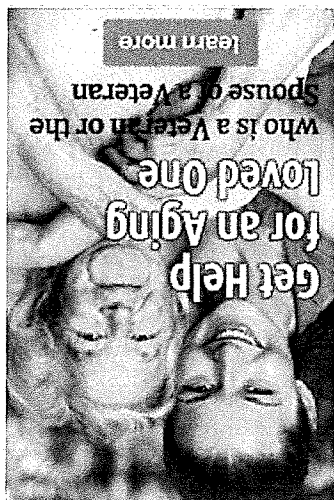

State veterans homes fill an important need for veterans with low income and veterans who desire to spend their last years with "comrades" from former active-duty. The predominant service offered is nursing home care. VA nursing homes must be licensed for their particular state and conform with skilled or intermediate nursing services offered in private sector nursing homes in that state. State homes may also offer assisted living or domiciliary care which is a form of supported independent living.

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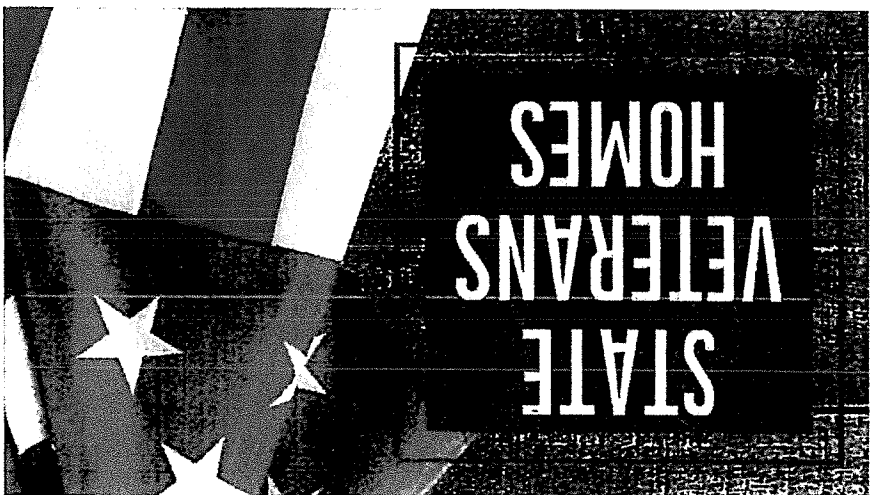

The requirements for admission to a state veterans home vary depending on the facility, state law, and other factors¹. However, in general, the following requirements apply^{2 3 4}:

- Honorable discharge or discharge not characterized as dishonorable
- State residency prior to admission
- Certification of need of assisted living or skilled nursing care as determined by a VA physician
- Veterans in need of skilled nursing care and who have a general/honorable military discharge are given admission priority
- Spouses, surviving spouses, and Gold Star parents in need of skilled nursing care are also eligible for admission, if allowed by state policy

Iowa State Veterans Home in Marshalltown, Iowa

The Iowa Veterans Home was built in 1887 and offers long-term care to qualifying military members with honorable discharges. Dependents and surviving spouses may also qualify for care if they meet admission requirements.

All applicants must be eligible for admission to a VA Medical Center and be Iowa residents. Spouses and surviving spouses of qualified veterans "are eligible for admission if they have been married to the veteran for one year before the date of application and meet the residency requirements of Iowa," according to the official site. The County Commissioners of Veterans Affairs (with an office in each Iowa County) is the admissions referral agency.

This facility features an infirmary, nursing home-style care with nearly 700 beds and "domiciliary care." Services may include:

- Medical
- Optometry
- Podiatry
- Dermatology
- Respiratory therapy
- Laboratory/x-ray
- Pharmacy
- Dental
- Nursing
- Psychology
- Physical and occupational therapy
- Audiology



Admission Requirements

Our Homes Residents must be:

- Discharged under honorable conditions from any branch of the U.S. armed forces and is a current resident of Minnesota, who served 181 consecutive days on active duty, unless discharged earlier because of disability incurred in the line of duty.
- The spouse of an eligible Veteran who is at least 55 years old and meets residency requirements.
- Able to demonstrate a medical or clinical need for admission.

Residents contribute to the cost of their care according to their means. For questions or more information, contact the benefit coordinator of each Home.

Eligibility For Residence In Home

10-2-403. Eligibility for residence in home. To be eligible for residence in a Montana veterans' home under rules prescribed by the department of public health and human services, a person must be a veteran or the spouse or surviving spouse of a veteran. Consideration must also be given to:

(1) the person's age;

(2) the person's physical and mental status;

(3) the person's ability or inability to locate suitable alternative accommodations;

(4) the person's term of residence in Montana;

(5) the person's gender as it relates to availability of appropriate living space;

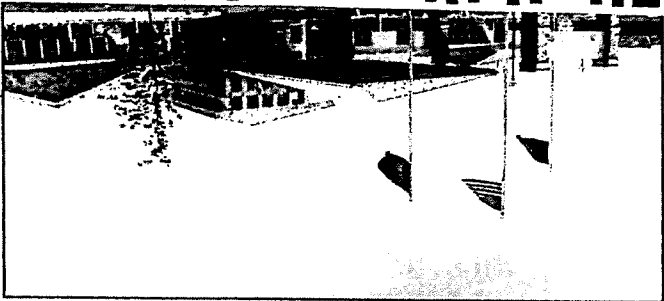
(6) the ability of the Montana veterans' home to meet the person's needs; and

(7) other admission requirements established by the department.

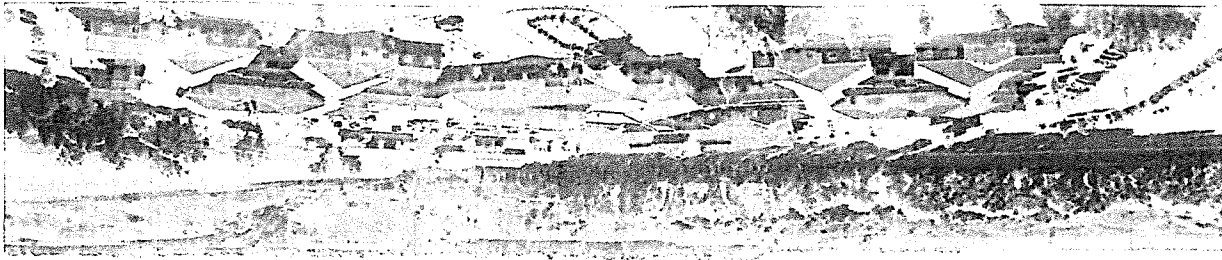

Eligibility and Admissions

Veterans who served on active duty in the armed forces of the United States and lived in Nebraska for at least two years during their lifetime may be eligible for admission to one of the Nebraska veterans homes; eligibility may extend to a spouse, surviving spouse, and Gold Star parents.

The North Dakota Veterans Home has 52 skilled nursing home beds and 98 basic care beds. We are dedicated to the health and welfare of each individual resident. Warm, friendly and compassionate staff treat each resident with the dignity and respect they deserve.



To be eligible for admission, individuals must meet one of the following criteria:

1. As defined in section 37-01-40;
A "veteran" is an individual who has served on continuous federalized active military duty for one hundred eighty days or the full period for which the individual was called or ordered to active military duty for reasons other than training, and who was discharged or released under other than dishonorable conditions. A discharge reflecting "expiration of term of service" or "completion of required service" or words to that effect qualifies the shorter term of service as making the individual veteran.

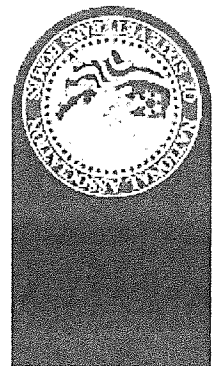
2. All service members of the United States armed forces, national guard, or reserve who were discharged or released under other than dishonorable conditions and who do not meet the definition of a veteran but who are or may become permanently disabled from any cause while in line and discharge of duty, and who are enrolled in veterans' affairs health care before admission to the veterans' home; and

3. The spouse or surviving spouse of an individual in subsection 1 or 2 if the spouse or surviving spouse

meets the requirements for admission under section 37-15-10.

No veteran may be considered eligible for residency whose last period of service in the armed services was terminated under dishonorable conditions.
No veteran may be admitted to the Veterans Home that has been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude, without producing sufficient evidence of subsequent good conduct and reformation of character so as to satisfy to the board of admissions.

Residency requirements: An applicant may not be admitted to the veterans' home unless the applicant is a bona fide resident of this state.



State of Wyoming Eligibility Requirements

ELIGIBILITY FOR MEMBERS:

✓ Applicant for admission to the Veterans' Home of Wyoming must be a resident, with a valid Wyoming address at the time of application.

✓ An applicant who has resided in the state less than one year must declare intent to permanently or indefinitely reside in Wyoming.

✓ Applicant cannot be in transit state or indicate temporary or seasonal residency. No minimum age for veterans providing they need domiciliary care and are unable to make a living. Veterans have first priority. Veterans' spouses, second priority. Non-veterans are admitted under special provisions.

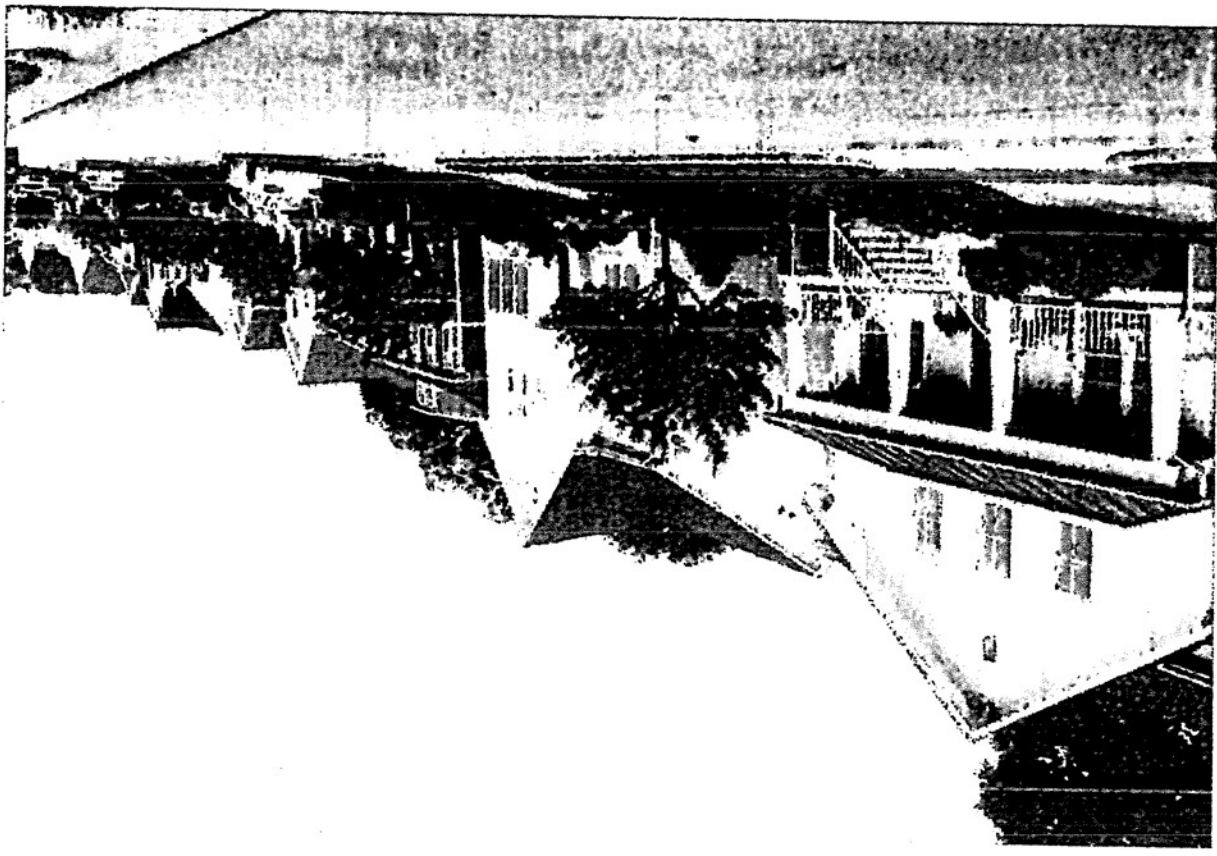

Iowa Property Tax Exemptions

The state of Iowa exempts qualifying veterans from state property taxes, according to the Iowa Department of Revenue. To qualify, veterans must have a 100% VA disability rating or receive Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) program benefits.

Description: Originally adopted to encourage home ownership for disabled veterans. The current credit is equal to 100% of the actual tax levy.

Eligibility: Veterans with a permanent service-connected disability rating of 100% qualify for this credit. Veterans also qualify who have a permanent and total disability rating based on individual unemployment paid at the 100% disability rate. The veteran must own and occupy the property as a homestead on July 1 of each year, declare residency in Iowa for income tax purposes and occupy the property for at least six months each year. Persons in the military or nursing homes who do not occupy the home are also eligible. A surviving spouse of a disabled veteran receiving DIC payments also qualifies. The surviving spouse as a beneficiary of the estate of a veteran who received the credit may continue to receive the credit as long as the spouse resides in the qualified homestead and does not remarry.

Filing Requirements: Claim must be filed on or before July 1. A current Benefits Paid letter and a DD214 must be included with your application.

Minnesota Property Tax Exemptions

In Minnesota, veterans with a 100% permanent and total VA disability rating may be eligible for a property tax valuation exemption of up to \$300,000, according to the Minnesota Department of Revenue. Those with disability ratings at 70% or higher may be eligible for an exclusion of up to \$150,000. A primary family caregiver may qualify for the exemption if the veteran does not own their home.

Montana Property Tax Exemptions

The Montana Disabled Veterans Assistance Program offers property tax reductions for those veterans with a 100% VA disability rating. The benefit is income-based, with exemptions ranging from 50-100%. Surviving spouses may also be eligible.

Nebraska Property Tax Exemption

Disabled veterans who are Nebraska state residents may be eligible for a homestead exemptions if they fall into one of these categories:

- Seniors over the age of 65
- Veterans with wartime service with a total non-service connected disability or illness
- Qualified disabled individuals
- Qualified totally disabled veterans and their surviving spouses
- Veterans (and their spouses) whose homes the VA substantially contributed to
- Individuals with a developmental disability

These tax exemptions are for primary residences.

According to the Nebraska Department of Revenue, veterans with service-connected disability with a VA rating of 100% are exempt from paying state property taxes, regardless of income level or value of the property. In many cases, surviving spouses may be eligible to apply. The amount of the exemption for all other categories ranges from 0 to 100% depending on household income and the assessed value of the property.

North Dakota Property Tax Exemption

North Dakota veterans with a service-connected VA disability rating of 50% or higher may qualify for a property tax credit, according to the North Dakota tax commissioner's office. The credit applies to the assessed value of the homestead. Amounts range between \$4,050 and \$8,100, depending on the disability rating.

South Dakota Property Tax Exemptions

According to the South Dakota Department of Revenue, veterans who are residents of the state may qualify for property tax exemptions of \$150,000 of the value of their primary residences. The veteran must have a 100% permanent and total VA disability rating to qualify.

Wisconsin Property Tax Exemption

Veterans with a 100% VA disability rating and their surviving spouses may qualify for Wisconsin property tax credits for the full amount of the taxes paid on a primary residence, according to the Wisconsin Department of Revenue. Veterans must have been state residents upon entry into military service or for five years after beginning military service.

Wyoming Property Tax Exemption

According to an Army list of **state veteran benefits**, veterans in Wyoming may qualify for a property tax exemption of \$3,000 of the assessed value of a primary residence.

The veteran must have a VA disability rating and must have been a state resident for at least three years at application time. If the property tax exemption is not used toward a home, veterans may apply it toward a motor vehicle license fee.

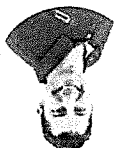

While all 50 states offer some sort of **property tax exemptions for disabled veterans**, our research and analysis uncovered **18 states with no property tax for disabled veterans**, meaning eligible veterans are exempt from paying **ANY** property tax on their primary residence.
