# Senate Bill 135

**AMENDMENT 135A** FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

## 1 An Act to authorize the payment of administrative expenses from revise provisions 2 related to habitat stamp sales.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 3

#### Section 1. That § 41-6-85 be AMENDED: 4

Section 1. That § 41-6-85 be AMENDED:
41-6-85. Except as otherwise provided in § 41-6-10.2 this section, a person
eighteen years of age or older shall purchase a habitat stamp when applying for or
purchasing a <u>fishing license, a hunting license,</u> or fishing furbearer a license to take fur-
bearing animals.
The fee for the cost of a habitat stamp-shall be is ten dollars for residents a resident
and twenty-five dollars for nonresidents a nonresident purchasing a one-day fishing
license. The cost of a habitat stamp for a nonresident, in all other cases, is twenty-five
dollars. A person is not required to purchase more than one habitat stamp within a license
period, as provided by the applicable license, and rules promulgated by the commission
under chapter 1-26.
Any person required to possess a <u>fishing license, a</u> huntin <u>g license,</u> or <del>fishing</del> <u>a</u>
license <u>to take fur-bearing animals</u> may not fish <del>and</del> , hunt, or trap without a <u>habitat</u> stamp
validation.
A purchase of the habitat stamp is not required for the one-day hunting or fishing
license, youth hunting license, private shooting preserve license, hunt for habitat
application fee, or landowner hunting license.

The requirement to purchase a habitat stamp, as set forth in this section, does not
apply to:
(1) A resident who meets the criteria set forth in 41-6-10.2;
(2) A resident applying for or purchasing:
(a) A one-day fishing license;

2	(c) A youth hunting license;
3	(d) A hunt for habitat raffle ticket; or
4	(e) A landowner hunting license;
5	(3) A resident applying for or purchasing a private shooting preserve license before
6	July 1, 2025;
7	(4) A nonresident applying for or purchasing:
8	(a) A youth hunting license; or
9	(b) A hunt for habitat raffle ticket; or
10	(5) A nonresident applying for or purchasing a private shooting preserve license before
11	<u>July 1, 2025.</u>
12	<u>A person who violates</u> this section is <u>guilty of a</u> Class 2 misdemeanor.
13	Section 2. That § 41-6-86 be AMENDED:
14	41-6-86. All revenue The department shall deposit money collected from the sale
15	of the a habitat stamp <u>, as</u> provided for in § 41-6-85 <del>-shall be deposited in<u>, into</u> the game,</del>
16	fish and parks fund for the purposes of enhancing <mark>. The department shall use the money</mark>
17	<u>to:</u>
18	(1) Enhance terrestrial habitat on public lands, providing;
19	(2) Provide additional public access to private lands; and
20	(3) Provide aquatic habitat enhancements on public waters. All fees collected from
21	persons who only purchase
22	The department may set aside an amount sufficient to pay any administrative
23	expenses incurred in carrying out the requirements of this section. The amount set aside
24	may not exceed one percent of the amount collected under § 41-6-85.
25	The department shall use any remaining money generated from the sale of a
26	habitat stamp, in connection with a fishing <del>licenses shall be used solely license,</del> for aquatic
27	habitat-and access projects in enhancements on public waters. All fees collected from
28	persons who only purchase
29	The department shall use any remaining money generated from the sale of a
30	habitat stamp, in connection with a hunting license or trapping licenses shall be used
31	<del>solely <mark>furbearer</mark> a license to take fur-bearing animals,</del> for terrestrial habitat and <u>programs</u>
32	that provide additional public access programs. All fees collected from persons that
33	purchase privileges to fish and hunt, or trap shall be extended equally for aquatic and to
34	private land.

1	<u>The department shall use any remaining</u> money generated from the sale of a
2	habitat stamp, in connection with a combination hunting and fishing license, in equal parts,
3	to enhance terrestrial habitat. Proceeds from the habitat stamp fee collected may not be
4	used on public lands and to provide aquatic habitat enhancements on public waters.
5	The department may not use money generated under § 41-6-85 to purchase
6	property in fee title.
7	The On or before October first of each year, the department shall deliver an annual
8	provide an itemized expenditure report to the Government Operations and Audit
