AMENDMENT 1238A FOR THE INTRODUCED BILL

1An Act to reimburse school districts for costs incurred in providing reduced price2meals to students.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 13-35-2 be AMENDED:

5 13-35-2. Pupils and employed personnel of the school district or other agencies 6 contracting with the Department of Education, who are fed through a school food services 7 program may be charged for meals If a student is eligible for free meals through the National School Lunch Program, 42 U.S.C. § 1751, et seg. (January 1, 2024), or the School 8 9 Breakfast Program, 42 U.S.C. § 1773 (January 1, 2024), the board of a school district 10 may not impose a charge upon the student for any meal provided through a school food 11 services program. 12 If a student is eligible for reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, the board of a school district may impose only 13 14 such meal charges upon the student as are permitted in accordance with the federal 15 programs. 16 If a student is not eligible for reduced-price meals through the National School 17 Lunch Program or the School Breakfast Program, but has a family income that is less than 18 two hundred and nine percent of the poverty line, as defined in the Omnibus Budget

19 <u>Reconciliation Act of 1981, 42 U.S.C. § 9902 (January 1, 2024), the district may provide</u>
20 the student with reduced-price meals, and charge the student an amount no greater than

- 20 that paid by a student who is eligible for reduced-price meals.
- 22 <u>The Department of Education shall, with moneys-appropriated in the General</u> 23 <u>Appropriations Act, from the Governor's Office of Economic Development Future Fund,</u> 24 <u>reimburse the school district for the costs incurred in providing meals to a student who is</u> 25 <u>not eligible for reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program or the</u> 26 <u>School Breakfast Program, but has a family income that is less than two hundred and nine</u>

percent of the poverty line, less any amount charged to the student in accordance with
this section.
