## Senate Bill 80

## HOUSE ENGROSSED

Introduced by: Senator Davis at the request of the Study Committee on Sustainable Models for Long Term Care

- An Act to improve technology equipment for providers of elderly care and to make an appropriation therefor.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the general fund the sum of \$2,000,000 to the
- 5 Department of Human Services, for providing grants to select providers for the purchase of
- 6 <u>technology equipment that would improve the quality of life and health outcomes of elderly</u>
- 7 <u>residents and support health care workers.</u>
- 8 **Section 2.** A select provider must be a state-licensed Medicaid provider that primarily serves
- 9 <u>elderly patients. A select provider shall fill out an application detailing what technology</u>
- 10 equipment will be used, the expected outcomes in terms of the quality of life and health
- outcomes for the provider's residents and support for the provider's health care workers to
- 12 <u>fulfill the worker's duties, and any other information necessary for the department to evaluate</u>
- 13 <u>an application.</u>
- 14 **Section 3.** Before any moneys are expended under this Act, the Department of Human
- 15 <u>Services shall evaluate each application based on the criteria on the application submitted in</u>
- 16 section 2 of this Act. The moneys appropriated in this Act must be expended for the technology
- 17 equipment described in the approved application.
- 18 **Section 4.** The department shall provide a report to the Joint Committee on Appropriations
- 19 <u>detailing how the grants were used. The report shall include providers awarded a grant using</u>
- 20 <u>the moneys in this Act, amount of money awarded to each provider, technology equipment</u>
- 21 <u>purchased, the use of the technology equipment, and the number of patients served through</u>
- 22 the grant.
- 23 **Section 5.** The secretary of the Department of Human Services shall approve vouchers and
- the state auditor shall draw warrants to pay expenditures authorized by this Act.

- 1 Section 6. Any amounts appropriated in this Act not lawfully expended or obligated shall
- 2 <u>revert in accordance with the procedures prescribed in chapter 4-8.</u>
- 3 **Section 7.** This Act is effective beginning June 29, 2024.
