SB 80	(Consideration of House Amendments) improve technology equipment for providers of elderly care and to make an appropriation therefor. (House Engrossed)
SB 137	(Consideration of House Amendments) repeal the expiration of a reduction in certain gross receipts and use tax rates. (House Engrossed)
SB 144	(Consideration of House Amendments) make an appropriation for grants to support airport terminal improvement, expansion, and infrastructure projects. (House Engrossed)
SB 146	(Consideration of House Amendments) revise and repeal provisions related to threatening persons holding statewide office, judicial officers, and elected officers and to provide a penalty therefor. (House Engrossed)
