- HB 1140 (Consideration of Senate amendments) (Removed from Consent Calendar) revise certain provisions relating to petitions containing illegal actions and to declare an emergency. (Senate Engrossed)
- HB 1200 (Consideration of Senate amendments) increase the minimum fee required with an application for construction of an energy conversion and transmission facility. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- HB 1244 (Consideration of Senate amendments) provide a process to withdraw a signature from a petition for an initiated measure, constitutional amendment, or a referendum on a law in certain situations and to declare an emergency. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- HB 1245 (Consideration of Senate amendments) revise provisions related to the custody of an alleged delinquent child before and after a temporary custody hearing. (Senate Judiciary Engrossed)
- HB 1257 (Consideration of Senate amendments) require the Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council to establish an interim study committee on minors' access to pornographic material. (Senate Engrossed)
