Title of Requested Study: Study of Property Tax Assessments and Valuations

Scope of Requested Study:

This study would address the increase in property valuations and the burden of property taxes, specifically on owner occupied single family dwellings and rental properties. Because of COVID-19, an increase of individuals moving to South Dakota, and low interest rates, property assessments have increased dramatically. According to data from the Department of Revenue for owner-occupied residential property for fiscal year 2020-2023, there was an increase of \$21,460,451,155 in property assessments. This represents an average 58.39% increase in assessments for tax purposes across the state. This especially causes a concern on the burden for young buyers and individuals 65 and over.

The purpose of the study would be to explore options to address the large increase in valuations and how to lessen the burden of property taxes, including an evaluation of the impact that limiting annual increases of valuations would have on the broader property tax system.

The committee would meet for four days, with one meeting in Sioux Falls, Rapid City, and Brookings or Aberdeen, respectively, and the final meeting in Pierre to finalize recommendations and proposed legislation.

If established, the interim committee could be tasked with the following: - full review of the DLR study - tour of current facilities - review of prison construction costs, scope of work and designs used, at prisons in other states, that are in progress or recently completed. - review of design & construction contracts, and plans in progress on the women's and men's prison - recommendations for design changes or construction experience. I may be overlooking some, but suggest that a majority of the members of the interim committee have construction experience including the following: Rep. Krohmer, (plumbing), Rep. Randolph (electrical), Rep. Mills (Gen. Contractor), Rep. Weisgram (flooring), Senator Deibert (surveying/civil eng.). I suggest the committee be no less than 5 members and no more than 9.
