Program Overview



Medical Cannabis Program Responsibilities

- Ensure a safe and effective medical cannabis program
- Regulation of medical cannabis industry: statutes, administrative rules, program policies and procedures
- Register and issue medical cannabis cards to patients and their caregivers



Additional Key Responsibilities

- Certify establishments:
 - Cultivators
 - Manufacturers
 - Dispensaries
 - Testing Facilities (laboratories)
- Inventory tracking statewide for all medical cannabis and cannabis products (Seed-to-Sale software program)
- Inspection of Establishments

Patients and Practitioners Overview

- In state
 - In person appointment only
- Out of state
 - the signed, dated, out of state certification that certifies patient as having a qualifying disabling condition
- Designated caregivers
- Home cultivation
 - Patients are allowed up to 2 immature and 2 mature plants



Bona Fide Practitioner-Patient Relationship

- Assessment of the patient's medical history and current medical condition, including an appropriate in-person physical examination
- Under the practitioner's care for the debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the medical use of cannabis or has been referred by the practitioner caring for the patient's debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the medical use of cannabis to another practitioner;



Bona Fide Practitioner-Patient Relationship continued

- The patient has a reasonable expectation that the practitioner providing the written certification will continue to provide follow-up care to the patient to monitor the medical use of cannabis
- Not for the sole purpose of providing a written certification for the medical use of cannabis, *unless* the patient has been referred by a practitioner providing care for the debilitating medical condition that qualifies the patient for the medical use of cannabis;



Debilitating Medical Conditions

- A chronic or debilitating disease or medical condition or its treatment that produces one or more of the following:
 - Cachexia or wasting syndrome
 - Severe, debilitating pain
 - Severe nausea, except nausea associated with pregnancy
 - Seizures
 - Severe and persistent muscle spasms




Debilitating Medical Conditions

- Acquired immune deficiency syndrome or positive status for human immunodeficiency virus
- Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis
- Multiple sclerosis
- Cancer or its treatment, if associated with severe or chronic pain, nausea or severe vomiting, or cachexia or severe wasting
- Crohn's disease
- Epilepsy and seizures
- Post-traumatic stress disorder





Medical Cannabis Patient Process Overview



Please Note: Patients can NOT start the medical cannabis application process until their practitioner creates a certification, which will automatically create a patient account on medcannabisapplication.sd.gov. In South Dakota, dispensaries, not pharmacies, sell cannabis. Medical certification is not a prescription.

Establishment Overview

- Program Staff review initial and annual renewal applications for certification as medical cannabis establishments
 - Included are review of operating procedures, site plans, security plans, equipment certification, local city/county certification, inventory tracking procedures






Total Approved Practitioners

Proposed Rules Change

- July 1, 2024: 2024 Legislative Session changes effective
- Proposed Rule change to amend establishment fees from \$5,310 to \$9,000 per certificate per year
 - Per Senate Bill 43
 - Hearing at Interim Legislative Rules Review Committee
 Tuesday, August 20



Software Contract End Dates

- Establishment and Cardholder Portal Contracts
 - End in August 2026
 - RFP process in 2025
 - Seed-to-Sale Inventory Tracking
 - Ends in August 2027
 - RFP process in 2026
