Senate Bill 77

- An Act to update terminology related to ambulance operators. 1
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 2
- 3 Section 1. That § 32-17-42 be AMENDED:
- **32-17-42.** Any A motor vehicle authorized may be equipped with blue lights if it 4 5 <u>is:</u> 6
 - (1) Authorized by the Department of Transportation, a;
 - (2) A tow truck or wrecker as defined in § 32-17-10₇; or a vehicle operated
 - (3) Operated by a:

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- (a) A member of an organized a fire department or organized search and rescue unit-or by a person who is an; or
- An ambulance driver, attendant, or emergency medical technician affiliated (b) with a licensed ambulance service may be equipped with blue lights operator certified in accordance with chapter 36-4B.

This provision does not relieve the driver of the vehicle from the duty to drive with due regard for the safety of all persons using the street, nor does it protect the driver from the consequence of a reckless disregard-of for the safety of others.

No person may use a blue light unless the person is authorized by this chapter and is operating a Department of Transportation vehicle or a county highway vehicle in performance of winter highway maintenance duties, or the person is actually en route to the scene of a fire or other emergency requiring the person's services and the person has been authorized in writing to-so use a blue light. Authorization for use of a blue light in accordance with this chapter may be given by the Department of Transportation, the highway patrol, a county highway superintendent, the chief of a fire department, the coordinator of a search and rescue unit, or-operator or ambulance service the director of an ambulance service, and only to members of the department or service who are in good standing.

1 The use of a blue light in violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.

Section 2. That § 32-31-4 be AMENDED:

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32-31-4. The speed—<u>limit_limits</u> set—<u>out_forth</u> in §§ 32-25-1.1 to 32-25-17, inclusive,—<u>does_do</u> not apply to any authorized emergency vehicle responding to an emergency call if the driver sounds an audible siren or air horn, or both, or displays flashing, oscillating, or rotating beams of red light, or combinations of red, blue, or white light, visible one hundred eighty degrees to the front of the vehicle. The lights must be capable of warning the public of the presence of an emergency vehicle under normal atmospheric conditions.

The speed-limit limits set-out forth in §§ 32-25-1.1 to 32-25-17, inclusive,-does do not apply to authorized emergency vehicles operated by law enforcement officers who are measuring the speed of other vehicles by use of the emergency vehicle speedometer.

An ambulance <u>driver who is operator</u> certified pursuant to chapter 36-4B may operate an ambulance in excess of the speed limit without audible signals while operating outside the city limits of a municipality.

Section 3. That § 34-11-12 be AMENDED:

- 17 **34-11-12.** Each ambulance run must include:
- 18 (1) One emergency medical technician or one advanced life support personnel, 19 licensed pursuant to chapter 36-4B; and
- 20 (2) One-driver ambulance operator certified in accordance with chapter 36-4B.

Section 4. That § 34-20A-100 be AMENDED:

- 34-20A-100. For the purposes of §§ 34-20A-98 to 34-20A-103, inclusive, the term, "first responder, includes" means:
- 24 (1) A law enforcement officer as defined by subdivision 22-1-2(22) § 22-1-2;
- 25 (2) A driver and attendant An individual responding to an emergency call as part of an ambulance service licensed pursuant to chapter 34-11; and or
- 27 (3) A firefighter.

Section 5. That § 36-4B-1 be AMENDED:

29 **36-4B-1.** Terms used in this chapter mean:

- "Advanced life support," a level of emergency care consisting of basic life support 1 (1) 2 procedures and definitive therapy; 3 "Advanced life support personnel," a person licensed by the board as: (2) 4 An emergency medical technician-intermediate/85; (a) 5 An emergency medical technician-intermediate/99; (b) 6 (c) An advanced emergency medical technician; or 7 (d) A paramedic; 8 (3) "Basic life support personnel," a person: 9 Certified by the board as an ambulance-driver operator; 10 (b) Licensed by the board as an emergency medical responder; or 11 Licensed by the board as an emergency medical technician; (c) 12 (4) "Board," the State Board of Medical and Osteopathic Examiners; 13 "Direct control," real-time communications during an ambulance run between (5) 14 emergency medical services personnel and a physician, physician assistant, or 15 nurse practitioner, licensed in this state; 16 "Emergency medical services," health care provided to a patient by emergency (6) 17 medical services personnel; 18 "Emergency medical services personnel," a person licensed by the board as: (7) 19 (a) An emergency medical responder; 20 An emergency medical technician; (b) 21 (c) An emergency medical technician-intermediate/85; 22 (d) An emergency medical technician-intermediate/99; 23 (e) An advanced emergency medical technician; or 24 (f) A paramedic; and 25 (8) "Indirect control," the establishment and implementation of guidelines, policies, and 26 protocols approved by a physician, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner, 27 licensed in this state. Section 6. That § 36-4B-35 be AMENDED: 28
- 36-4B-35. The board shall promulgate rules, pursuant to chapter 1-26, to:

 10 Provide for an application form and process for the licensure of emergency medical services personnel and the certification of ambulance-drivers operators;

 11 Set forth criteria for educational and training program approval, including instructor qualifications, student acceptance, and clinical requirements;

2		Emergency Medical Technicians requirements, for applicants seeking licensure as
3		emergency medical services personnel;
4	(4)	Provide for the renewal of ambulance driver operator certification and continuing

Section 7. That § 36-4B-41 be AMENDED:

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- 20 **36-4B-41.** The board may issue a certification as an ambulance <u>driver operator</u> to a person who:
- 22 (1) Completes an emergency care course approved by the board; and
- 23 (2) Applies on a form prescribed by the board.
