23 **SJR 502:**A JOINT RESOLUTION, Applying to the United States Congress for a convention of
24 the states to propose amendments to the United States Constitution regarding the imposition of
25 fiscal restraints on the federal government, further limiting the power and jurisdiction of the federal
26 government, and limiting the terms of office for members of Congress and other federal officials.

27 Was read the second time.
