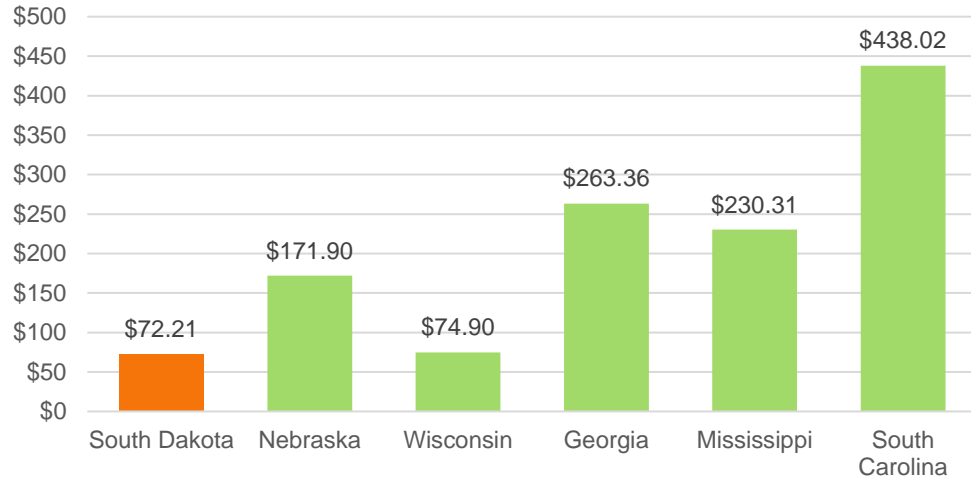

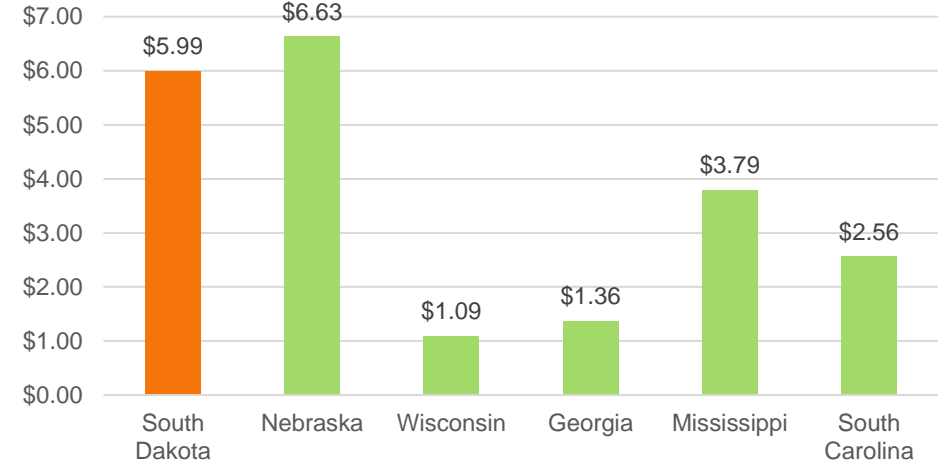

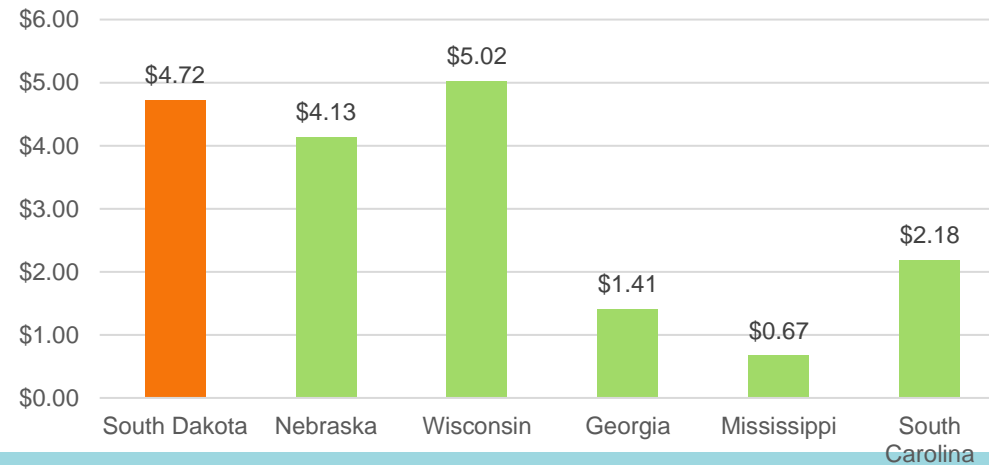
### State Funding by Geographic Area



### State Funding Per Capita

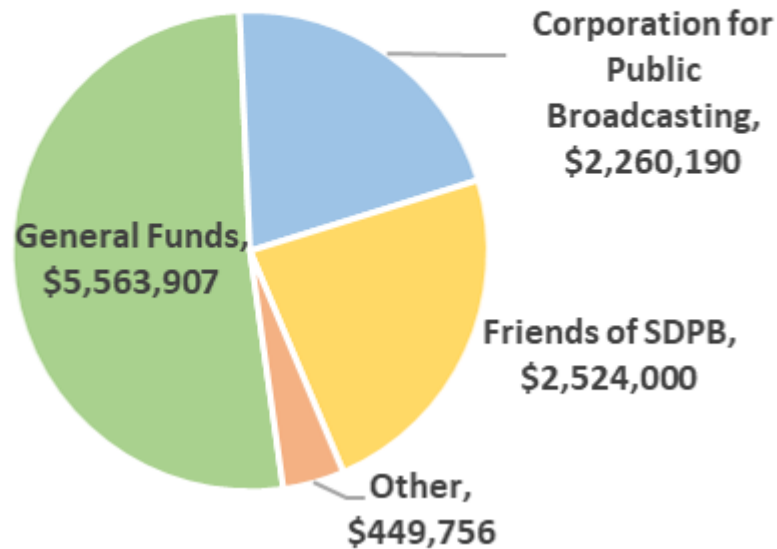


### FY23 Fundraising Per Capita

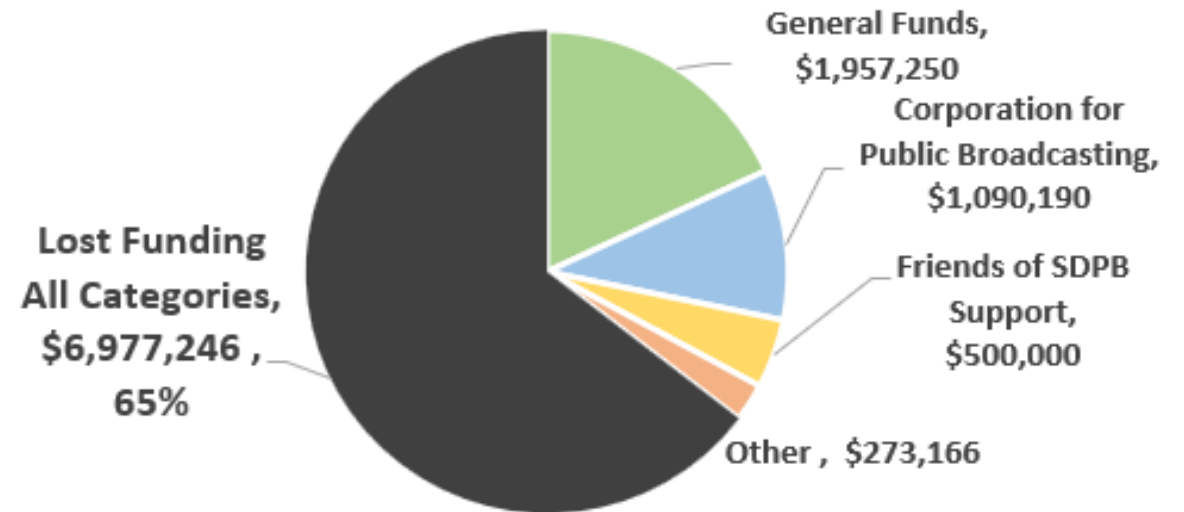


# Impacts to Funding
