

2025 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1172

Introduced by: Representative Randolph

An Act to require that a high school health curriculum include human sexuality and human development within the womb.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 13-33:

5	The board of each school district shall ensure that the health curriculum offered to
6	students in grades nine through twelve incorporates, by means of oral, written, or digital
7	lessons, or by means of lectures or presentations, information about human sexuality as
8	it relates to sexual activity and pregnancy in the context of student health and healthy
9	relationships, and human biology as it relates to pregnancy and human development
10	inside the womb. The information must include at least two of the following:
11	(1) A video presentation that uses a high-quality, computer-generated rendering or
12	animation to demonstrate the process of a chemical abortion in the first trimester;
13	(2) A video presentation that uses a high-quality, computer-generated rendering or
14	animation to demonstrate the process of a surgical abortion in the first trimester;

(3) A video presentation that uses a high-quality, computer-generated rendering or
 animation to demonstrate the process of a surgical abortion in the second
 trimester.

19 Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 13-33:

- 20 <u>Nothing in section 1 of this Act authorizes any individual employed by or under</u>
 21 <u>contract with a school district to refer a student for abortion services.</u>
- 22 Section 3. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 13-33:

- <u>The curricular material and information referenced in section 1 of this Act may not</u>
 <u>be offered, furnished, or sponsored by an individual who performs or by an entity that</u>
 provides elective abortion services. Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 13-33:
- 5 <u>The attorney general may petition the circuit court to enforce compliance under</u> 6 <u>this Act.</u>
