Senate Concurrent Resolution 602

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Celebrating the sister-state relationship with Taiwan.

- WHEREAS, South Dakota and Taiwan, which share the values of freedom, democracy, rule of law, and respect for human rights, have been in a sister-state relationship since 1984;
- 4 <u>and</u>
- 5 <u>WHEREAS</u>, South Dakota and Taiwan have enjoyed a mutually beneficial bilateral trade 6 relationship, in which Taiwan is a major trade partner of South Dakota, and continued growth 7 in that relationship is anticipated; and
- 8 WHEREAS, in June of 2024, Lieutenant Governor Larry Rhoden led a trade delegation of 9 state officials and industry leaders to Taiwan, to explore trade opportunities in high-tech 10 industries; and
- 11 WHEREAS, on June 28, 2024, South Dakota State University and National Chung Hsing
 12 University signed an academic cooperation agreement to expand academic collaboration and
 13 bilateral exchanges in the agricultural sector; and
- WHEREAS, the Republic of China, which is also known as Taiwan, has been a sovereign state for over one hundred years, and the People's Republic of China's so-called "One China Principle," is baseless; and
- WHEREAS, the negotiation of a fair and reciprocal bilateral trade agreement between
 Taiwan and the United States is an important step toward strengthening mutual investment
 between South Dakota and Taiwan;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the One Hundredth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that South Dakota celebrates the 41st anniversary of its sister-state relationship with Taiwan; supports the further strengthening of trade relations and academic exchanges between South Dakota and Taiwan; supports the signing of the Agreement on Avoidance of Double Taxation between

- 1 the United States and Taiwan; supports Taiwan's inclusion in the Indo-Pacific Economic
- 2 Framework for Prosperity and other international organizations which are significant to the
- 3 <u>health, safety, and well-being of all people; and commends Taiwan's vibrant democracy.</u>
