Senate Concurrent Resolution 604

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Supporting the expansion of transportation services 2 for veterans receiving medical care in this state. 3 WHEREAS, veterans who live in rural areas face significant challenges when seeking 4 medical care, exacerbated by ineffective public transportation and a shortage of volunteer 5 <u>Veterans Transportation Service drivers and vehicles compliant with the Americans with</u> 6 Disabilities Act; and 7 WHEREAS, preventive medical care promotes early intervention, which can improve veterans' health outcomes and ensure timely access to the United States Department of 8 9 Veterans Affairs health care system; and 10 WHEREAS, veterans seeking medical care are often high-risk patients, and require safe 11 and reliable transportation to make it to their appointments on time, yet many volunteer 12 drivers are over the age of sixty-five and are not equipped to handle medical emergencies; 13 and 14 WHEREAS, the Highly Rural Transportation Grant program assists veterans in eligible 15 counties to travel to United States Department of Veterans Affairs health facilities to receive 16 medical care through partnerships with veteran service organizations and state veterans 17 service agencies; and 18 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs reimburses eligible veterans 19 for travel to and from approved health facilities if the veteran meets certain requirements, 20 including having a disability rating of thirty percent or higher, or if the veteran is traveling for 21 treatment of a service-connected condition; and 22 WHEREAS, veterans with a disability rating less than thirty percent deserve the right to

transportation for medical care, whether or not the care is for a service-connected condition;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the One Hundredth Legislature of
the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the
Legislature urges the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to expand the availability
of transportation services for veterans seeking medical care, in coordination with affiliates
and local community partners, including adding more modes of transportation compliant with
the Americans with Disabilities Act; and

- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislature urges the United States Department of

 Veterans Affairs to expand eligibility requirements for travel reimbursement to include

 veterans without a service-connected disability and for travel to any treatment at an approved

 facility; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislature celebrates the Highly Rural Transportation

 Grant program and supports its expansion to meet the needs of veterans in this state.
