

2025 South Dakota Legislature Senate Concurrent Resolution 606

1 2 3 4 5 6	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Expressing the Legislature's concern about the potential for a carbon oxide pipeline to become a weapon of mass destruction to be used by terrorists or unfriendly governments and urging the Public Utilities Commission to conduct risk assessments and establish stronger regulatory and security measures for carbon oxide pipelines to ensure adequate state, county, business, and family emergency response planning.
7	WHEREAS, the development and expansion of carbon oxide pipelines have increased
8	significantly across the United States to accommodate carbon capture and sequestration
9	projects; and
10	WHEREAS, carbon oxide pipelines are vulnerable to cyberattacks, sabotage, and terrorist
11	attacks targeting energy and other infrastructure to inflict mass casualties or disrupt
12	economies; and
13	WHEREAS, pipelines transporting hazardous substances, including carbon oxide, are
14	attractive targets for terrorists due to the potential to cause widespread damage and loss of
15	life; and
16	WHEREAS, carbon oxide pipelines pose unique dangers due to the asphyxiating properties
17	of carbon oxide for instance, which is a dense, odorless, and colorless gas that can settle in
18	low-lying areas and displace oxygen; and
19	WHEREAS, a breach or targeted attack of a carbon oxide pipeline could result in a rapid
20	and catastrophic release of carbon oxide, potentially leading to mass asphyxiation in nearby
21	communities and creating a weapon of mass destruction scenario; and
22	WHEREAS, there is insufficient federal oversight and regulation of carbon oxide pipelines,
23	including gaps in emergency response planning, pipeline material standards, and public
24	awareness of the risks posed by carbon oxide pipelines; and

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1	WHEREAS, there is a need for heightened awareness, enhanced regulatory measures, and
2	comprehensive security protocols to mitigate the risks associated with carbon oxide pipelines
3	and to protect public safety; and
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4	WHEREAS, families and businesses in South Dakota have a right to information about the
5	risks posed to them by carbon oxide pipelines so that they are able to prepare family and
6	business shelter in place and/or evacuation plans in the event of a terrorist or accidental
7	release of carbon oxide, such that the public's need for information must be balanced against
8	the need to prevent terrorists from acquiring information that would substantially facilitate
9	acts of terrorism; and
10	WHEREAS, South Dakota's counties have a duty to protect individuals, families, and
11	businesses from the risks created by carbon through wise land use permitting that avoids
12	creating risks of mass-casualty events and minimizes risks to families and businesses, and
13	through robust interagency emergency response planning, and such permitting and planning
14	requires access to carbon oxide pipeline safety-related risk information;
15	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the One
16	Hundredth Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the
17	Legislature expresses its deep concern to the Public Utilities Commission about the potential
18	for carbon oxide pipelines to be exploited as weapons of mass destruction by terrorist groups
19	or hostile governments, posing significant threats to public safety, critical infrastructure, and
20	state and national security; and
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislature urges the Public Utilities Commission to
22	conduct comprehensive risk assessments of carbon oxide pipelines and establish stronger
23	regulatory and security measures to prevent the use of carbon oxide pipelines as weapons of
24	mass destruction, taking into account the need for safety-related information by county

25 <u>zoning departments, emergency response agencies, businesses, families, and individuals.</u>
