Senate Concurrent Resolution 608

Introduced by: Senator Foster

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, To provide for an interim study to examine the South Dakota criminal justice system with a focus on substance abuse, mental health issues, and corrections.

4 <u>WHEREAS, the South Dakota criminal justice system faces challenges in addressing</u>
 5 <u>substance abuse and recidivism; and</u>

- 6 <u>WHEREAS, there is a need to explore alternative models and effective strategies for</u> 7 criminal justice reform; and
- 8 WHEREAS, substance abuse is a significant driver of criminal behavior in South Dakota;
 9 and

10 <u>WHEREAS</u>, there is a growing movement to shift substance abuse from a criminal justice
 11 issue to a public health issue; and

WHEREAS, many states have implemented successful models to address substance abuse
 and mental health issues through corrections reform that could be utilized in South Dakota;

- 14 <u>NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the One Hundredth Legislature of</u> 15 the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the
- 16 Executive Board of the Legislative Research Council establish an interim committee to conduct

17 <u>a comprehensive review of the South Dakota adult and juvenile criminal justice system with</u>

18 <u>a particular focus on recidivism, substance abuse, and substance abuse and mental health</u>

- 19 <u>treatment; and</u>
- 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee analyze successful models of

21 corrections and evaluate the performance of South Dakota's adult and juvenile correctional

22 systems, including rates of recidivism at one-year, three-year, and five-year intervals; and

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1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee explore how other states have
2	successfully addressed substance abuse and recidivism and provide recommendations on how
3	to transform substance abuse in South Dakota from a criminal justice issue to a public health
4	issue; and
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5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee review the effectiveness of
6	addiction and mental health treatment programs and vocational and education programs
7	within the criminal justice system and recommend improvements or changes; and
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee examine the effectiveness of
9	statewide specialty courts and provide recommendations to standardize and potentially
10	expand specialty courts across the state; and
11	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee review the funding and caseloads
12	for court services officers and parole agents and identify areas for improvement; and
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13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee seek relevant input from past and
14	current employees and inmates of the criminal justice system to gain insight into the strengths
15	and weaknesses of the system; and
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee investigate the role of the
17	Corrections Commission, including its regularity of meetings and the gualifications required
18	for membership on the commission, to ensure the commission is fulfilling its intended
19	purpose; and
20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the interim committee report its findings and
21	recommendations, together with any proposed legislation, to the Executive Board of the

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22 Legislative Research Council, on or before December 1, 2025.
