25 services personnel and to declare an emergency.

26 **SB 42**: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to clarify the wholesale purchase price of tobacco
27 products.

28 **SB 43**: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to establish a timeframe within which a remote seller
29 and marketplace provider must register and remit sales tax.

30 And signed the same in the presence of the House.
