26 with an individual of the opposite sex has a private cause of action for declaratory and injunctive  
27 relief against the state or political subdivision.

28 Any civil action brought pursuant to this section must be initiated within two years of the  
29 violation. An individual who is aggrieved under this section and prevails in court may recover  
30 reasonable attorney fees and costs from the state or offending political subdivision."
