MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

SB 177 (Intent to Reconsider Vote by Which Lost) provide a sales and use tax refund for goods and services related to data center operations.

SB 123 revise provisions related to forensic medical examinations. (Introduced)

SB 167 revise certain provisions pertaining to municipal government.

SCR 605 Promoting a resilient and healthy Black Hills forest through active forest management and retention of the current forest products industry.

HB 1074 modify the individuals eligible to sign an affidavit of homelessness for purposes of obtaining a free copy of a birth certificate. (Introduced)
HB 1075 modify the persons eligible to sign an affidavit for proof of homelessness for purposes of waiving the fee for a nondriver identification card. (Introduced)

SECOND READING OF SENATE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SB 62 (Deferred from 21st LD) establish mandatory reporting requirements related to improper governmental conduct and crime, and to provide a penalty therefor. (Senate Judiciary Engrossed)
SB 156 increase the minimum age for marriage. (Introduced)
SB 185 amend provisions pertaining to the process by which the address qualifications of a registered voter are verified.
(Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
SB 196 (Deferred from 21st LD) incorporate the Oceti Sakowin Essential Understandings in public school curriculum. (Senate Education Engrossed)
