4 **43-41B-24.** Except as otherwise provided by this section, the administrator shall promptly
5 deposit in the general fund ~~of this state~~ all moneys received under this chapter, including the
6 proceeds from the sale of abandoned property under § 43-41B-23, not to exceed the general fund
7 contribution limit, as defined in section 3 of this Act, in a fiscal year.

9 an amount not more than five hundred thousand dollars from which the administrator must make
10 prompt payment of claims duly allowed. Before making the deposit, the administrator must record

13 beneficiary, and with respect to each policy or contract listed in the report of an insurance company,
14 its number, the name of the company, and the amount due. The record must be available for public
15 inspection at all reasonable business hours."

18 **43-41B-24.1.** Money in the unclaimed property ~~trust~~ operating fund for the payment of claims

20 those holders is continuously appropriated. Expenditures for claims and costs incurred in examining
21 records of holders of property and in collecting the property from those holders must be paid upon
22 warrants drawn by the state auditor pursuant to vouchers authorized by the state treasurer. All
23 moneys paid out by the state treasurer for claims and costs incurred in examining records of holders
24 of property and in collecting the property from those holders under chapter 43-41B must be set
25 forth in an informational budget as described in § 4-7-7.2 and be annually reviewed by the
26 Legislature."

5 Mehlhaff, Nelson, Perry, Peterson (Sue), Pischke, Voight, Voita, and Zikmund

6 Nays: Crabtree, Davis, Deibert, Duhamel, Grove, Kolbeck (Steve), Larson, Miskimins, Otten,
7 Reed, Rohl, Sauder, Schoenfish, Smith, Vilhauer, and Wheeler

8 So the bill having received an affirmative vote of a majority of the members-elect, the President
9 declared the bill passed and the title was agreed to.

10 **SIGNING OF BILLS**

11 The President publicly read the title to

12 **SB 47**: FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to clarify eligibility for licensure as a video lottery
13 operator.

14 And signed the same in the presence of the Senate.

15 Sen. Miskimins moved that the Senate do now adjourn, which motion prevailed and at
16 4:31 p.m. the Senate adjourned.
