CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS OF COMMITTEES (AMENDED BILLS)

SB 54, SB 155

SECOND READING AND CONSIDERATION OF CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS

- SB 120 update the membership of the Animal Industry Board to include a poultry producer. (Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Engrossed)
- SB 166 clarify that a digital network is not subject to a cause of action based on the doctrine of product liability. (Introduced)
- SB 215 remove the prohibition against a landowner having an easement on the landowner's property. (Senate Judiciary Engrossed)
- HB 1118 prohibit the award or use of state moneys for the research, production, promotion, sale, or distribution of cell-cultured protein. (House Agriculture and Natural Resources Engrossed)

SECOND READING OF SENATE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- SB 26 reduce employer contribution rates and increase the administrative fee rate for reemployment assistance. (Introduced)
- SB 28 revise provisions relating to licensing fees and license renewal dates for the practice of barbering and to declare an emergency. (Introduced)
- SB 65 provide for the sale of certain real estate located in Pennington County and to provide for the deposit of the proceeds. (Joint Appropriations Engrossed)
- SB 123 (Removed from Consent Calendar) revise provisions related to forensic medical examinations. (Introduced)
- SB 175 create provisions governing litigation financing. (Senate Judiciary Engrossed)
- SB 185 (Deferred from 22nd LD) amend provisions pertaining to the process by which the address qualifications of a registered voter are verified. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- SB 208 amend provisions pertaining to a school district's proposed opt out, capital outlay certificate, or other agreement. (Senate Education Engrossed)
- SCR 605 (Removed from Consent Calendar) Promoting a resilient and healthy Black Hills forest through active forest management and retention of the current forest products industry. (Introduced)

SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- HB 1053 require age verification by websites containing material that is harmful to minors, and to provide a penalty therefor. (House Engrossed)
- HB 1109 prohibit the manufacture, sale, or distribution of cell-cultured meat in this state, and to provide a penalty therefor.
