SENATE APPROPRIATIONS ENGROSSED

Introduced by: Senator Karr

1An Act to require legislative approval for significant capital expenditures by the2Department of Game, Fish and Parks.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 41-2-19 be AMENDED:

5 **41-2-19.** The Subject to section 2 of this Act, the Department of Game, Fish and 6 Parks may, on behalf and in the name of the state, acquire public or private property by 7 gift, grant, devise, purchase, lease, or condemnation proceedings, and may manage, 8 control, and improve the property for the purpose of exercising the powers granted in this 9 title.

10 Section 2. That a NEW SECTION be added to chapter 41-2:

11 Notwithstanding any provision of this title to the contrary, the Department of 12 Game, Fish and Parks may not acquire, build, or significantly improve a building, facility, 13 or other physical asset, or build or significantly improve any infrastructure, or enter into a lease or a lease-purchase agreement, if doing so would require a cumulative capital 14 expenditure in excess of two million five hundred thousand dollars, without first obtaining 15 16 the express approval of the Legislature. 17 Notwithstanding any provision of this title to the contrary, the Department of 18 Game, Fish and Parks may not acquire any public or private real property if doing so would 19 require a cumulative capital expenditure in excess of two million five hundred thousand dollars, without first obtaining: 20 21 The express approval of the Legislature; or (1) 22 The express approval of the special committee created in accordance with § 4-8A-(2) 23 <u>2, if:</u> 24 Time is of the essence; and <u>(a)</u> 25 The Legislature is in a recess or between sessions. (b)

1	No acquisition, construction, improvement, or contract described in this section
2	may be divided so as to require multiple smaller capital expenditures in order to avoid or
3	otherwise defeat the approval threshold established in this section.
4	Any contract entered into in violation of this section is voidable in a legal action
5	initiated by the attorney general.

The applicability of this section includes any action authorized under this title.
