6 guidelines, policies, and code of conduct developed under § 1-56-6. If a state agency fails to comply
7 with the access requirements provided under this section, the state auditor may initiate action in
8 accordance with chapter 21-34.

9 The state auditor may employ and compensate necessary personnel to assist the internal
10 control auditor in performing the duties of this section."
