- HB 1036 establish a minimum combined balance of the budget reserve fund and general revenue replacement fund. (Introduced)
- HB 1037 suspend the tax collection allowance credit for filing returns and remitting taxes electronically. (House Engrossed)

- HB 1052 prohibit the exercise of eminent domain for a pipeline that carries carbon oxide. (Introduced)
- HB 1069 regulate vapor products, to authorize a new tax, and to provide a penalty therefor. (Senate Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
- HB 1132 establish provisions for eligibility in the child care assistance program for certain child care employees. (House Engrossed)
- HB 1164 revise the process for nominating candidates for lieutenant governor. (Introduced)
- HB 1221 make an appropriation for victim services provided by nonprofit organizations. (House Judiciary Engrossed)
- HB 1222 expand the authorized carrying, possession, and storage of a concealed pistol. (House Judiciary Engrossed)
- HB 1232 modify requirements relating to the operation of salons and booths and to declare an emergency. (Senate Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
- HJR 5002 (Deferred from 30<sup>th</sup> LD) Applying to the United States Congress under Article V of the United States Constitution to call for a convention for proposing an amendment to the constitution establishing congressional term limits. (Introduced)
