MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

- HB 1007 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) prohibit use of the South Dakota public utilities commission gross receipts tax fund for reimbursement of costs incurred by the Public Utilities Commission. (Senate Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
- HB 1062 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) amend provisions pertaining to the maintenance and publication of the statewide voter registration file. (Senate Engrossed)
- HB 1066 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) revise residency requirements for the purposes of voter registration. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- HB 1135 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) provide opportunities for treatment courts for South Dakotans, create a workgroup to study rehabilitation programs, and declare an emergency. (Senate Engrossed)
- HB 1143 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) require that the director of equalization adjust certain agricultural land values. (Senate Local Government Engrossed)
- HB 1169 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) modify the signature requirement for a petition to initiate a constitutional amendment. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- HB 1208 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) designate an individual using the address of a mail forwarding service or post office box when applying to register as a voter or vote by absentee ballot as a federal voter. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- HB 1218 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) address the imposition of firearm restrictions on certain employees, officers, volunteers, and other individuals. (Senate Engrossed)
- HB 1230 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) revise a provision related to unauthorized distribution of fentanyl and provide a penalty therefor. (Senate Judiciary Engrossed)

- HB 1245 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) exempt from the state sales and use tax gross receipts for certain services to a partnership. (Senate Taxation Engrossed)
- HB 1259 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) prohibit unauthorized access to certain multi-occupancy rooms. (Senate Engrossed) (Fiscal Note)
