13 The Speaker publicly read the title to

14 **HB 1005:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to modify the requirement for payment of a private
15 home study by the Department of Social Services.

16 **HB 1039:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to amend the programs reimbursing a teacher or
17 school counselor for earning national board certification.

18 **HB 1130:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to provide permissible dates for municipal and school
19 district elections.

20 **HB 1184:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to amend the deadline for filing a petition to initiate
21 a measure or constitutional amendment.

22 **HB 1256:** FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to require the inclusion of certain information on a
23 candidate's nominating petition or on a ballot question petition.
