19 CONSIDERATION OF EXECUTIVE VETOES AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Senate proceeded to the reconsideration of **HB 1169**, pursuant to the veto of the Governor and the veto message found on page 553 on the House Journal as provided in Article IV, Section 4, of the Constitution of the State of South Dakota.
