1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, urging the United States Department of Homeland
2	Security to establish a tribal law enforcement training academy in South
3	Dakota.
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4	WHEREAS, the state of South Dakota recognizes the critical role played by tribal law
5	enforcement agencies in ensuring public safety and upholding the rule of law for all citizens;
6	<u>and</u>
7	WHEREAS, the state of South Dakota values collaboration between state and federal
8	entities to enhance public safety initiatives and strengthen the capabilities of law enforcement
9	agencies; and
10	WHEREAS, the establishment of a tribal law enforcement training academy in South
11	Dakota would provide an opportunity to enhance the skills and training of law enforcement
12	personnel serving Native American communities, thereby contributing to the overall safety
13	and well-being of tribal members; and
14	WHEREAS, South Dakota is home to nine tribal nations, each with its unique heritage and
15	law enforcement needs, making it an ideal location for a tribal law enforcement training
16	academy that can tailor its programs to the specific challenges and nuances of the region;

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18	WHEREAS, its central location makes South Dakota an ideal location for a tribal law
19	enforcement training academy that serves individuals from across the United States; and
20	WHEREAS, the state of South Dakota is committed to supporting initiatives that promote
21	professionalism, cultural sensitivity, and excellence in law enforcement to better serve and
22	protect all residents; and
23	WHEREAS, South Dakota, in partnership with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, has begun to
24	offer law enforcement training programs that prioritizes officers serving one of the nine tribal
25	nations located in the state and focuses on the law enforcement needs of these communities;

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the House of Representatives of the One Hundred 2 First Legislature of the State of South Dakota, the Senate concurring therein, that the 3 Legislature urges the United States Department of Homeland Security to establish a tribal law 4 enforcement training academy in South Dakota; and 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislature encourages the United States Department of Homeland Security to collaborate with tribal leaders, state law enforcement agencies, and 6 7 relevant stakeholders to ensure that the training programs offered at the academy address 8 the unique needs and cultural context of the tribal communities in the region; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be transmitted to the secretary 10 of the United States Department of Homeland Security, the South Dakota Congressional 11 delegation, and the leader of each of the nine federally recognized Indian tribes located wholly 12 or partially within the state.
