1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to recognize certain federal forms as sufficient to direct the
2 disposition of the body of a servicemember.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That chapter 34-26 be amended by adding thereto a NEW SECTION to read as
5 follows:

6 If a decedent dies while serving in any branch of the United States armed forces, the United
7 States reserve forces, or the national guard, as provided by 10 U.S.C. 1481 section (a)(1) to (8),
8 inclusive, and the decedent has designated a person authorized to direct disposition of human
9 remains on a United States Department of Defense record of emergency (DD form 93), a
10 successor form, or an equivalent form, the duty to bury the decedent or to provide other funeral



- 1 and disposition arrangements for the decedent devolves to the person designated by the
- 2 decedent.
