MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS

- HB 1188 (Consideration of Senate Amendments) limit the liability of law enforcement officers and others when removing a disabled vehicle from a highway, a right of way, or public waters. (Senate Transportation Engrossed)
- SB 223 (Intent to Reconsider Vote by Which Lost) modify the requirements for a petition to refer an excess tax levy of a school district to a vote. (Senate State Affairs Engrossed)

CONSIDERATION OF REPORTS OF COMMITTEES (AMENDED BILLS)

SB 90 (Consent Calendar), SB 131, SB 132 (Consent Calendar), SB 214, HB 1200, HB 1202

SECOND READING AND CONSIDERATION OF CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS

- SB 154 clarify the eligibility of multiple garages or structures to be classified as owner-occupied. (Introduced)
- SB 35 revise the process for requesting a veteran's certificate of discharge from a county register of deeds. (Introduced)
- SB 15 create the Developmental Disability Service Delivery Committee. (Senate Health and Human Services Engrossed)
- SB 87 clarify and establish requirements related to forensic medical examinations. (Senate Health and Human Services Engrossed)

SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- HB 1261 provide a tax credit for owner-occupied property, to make an appropriation therefor, and to transfer moneys to the general fund. (Joint Appropriations Engrossed)
- HB 1086 make an appropriation for providing a grant to a nonprofit that delivers programming to support offenders and correctional staff. (Introduced)
- HB 1200 make an appropriation for victim services provided by nonprofit organizations. (Joint Appropriations Engrossed)
- HB 1202 authorize the construction of a trades center on the campus of Lake Area Technical College, to make an appropriation therefor, and to declare an emergency. (Joint Appropriations Engrossed)

SECOND READING OF SENATE BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- SB 164 (Removed from Consent Calendar) require that any holder of a commercial driver license in this state must be proficient in the English language, and to provide a penalty therefor. (House Transportation Engrossed)
- SB 36 authorize certain utilities to establish wildfire mitigation plans and associated liability limitations for wildfire damages.
(House Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
- SB 93 prohibit certain state officers or employees from being employed by an organization that was the recipient of a contract awarded on behalf of a state agency for a period of time. (House State Affairs Engrossed)
- SB 190 codify the rights of a parent. (House State Affairs Engrossed)
- SB 176 amend the period of time before which ballots and other election materials may be destroyed following an election. (Introduced)
- SB 177 clarify the requirements for marking an optical scan ballot.
(Senate State Affairs Engrossed)
- SB 60 restrict ownership of real property interests by certain prohibited entities and to provide for enforcement. (Senate Commerce and Energy Engrossed)
- SB 236 create the county and township infrastructure fund for the accounting, safekeeping, and allocation of unobligated rural access infrastructure fund moneys. (Senate Local Government Engrossed)
- SB 237 require that counties provide written notice to township supervisors of conditional use applications and appeals.
(Senate Local Government Engrossed)

- SB 3A limit the types of residential improvements for which counties, municipalities, and townships may require a permit. (House Local Government Engrossed)
