1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain mandatory reporting requirements for elder 2 and disabled adult abuse and neglect. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA: 4 Section 1. That § 22-46-9 be amended to read: 5 22-46-9. Any person who is a: 6 Physician, dentist, doctor of osteopathy, chiropractor, optometrist, podiatrist, 7 religious healing practitioner, hospital intern or resident, nurse, paramedic, 8 emergency medical technician, social worker, or any health care professional; 9 Long-term care ombudsman; 10 Psychologist, licensed mental health professional, or counselor engaged in 11 professional counseling; or 12 State, county, or municipal criminal justice employee or law enforcement officer; 13 who knows, or has reasonable cause to suspect, that an elder or disabled adult has been or is 14 being abused or neglected, shall, within twenty-four hours, report such the knowledge or 15 suspicion orally or in writing to the state's attorney of the county in which the elder or disabled

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adult resides or is present, to the Department of Social Services, or to a law enforcement officer.

- 2 Any person who knowingly fails to make the required report is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- For the purposes of this section, the term, person, means:
- 4 (1) Physician, dentist, doctor of osteopathy, chiropractor, optometrist, podiatrist,
- 5 <u>religious healing practitioner, hospital intern or resident, nurse, paramedic,</u>
- 6 <u>emergency medical technician, social worker, or any health care professional;</u>
- 7 (2) Psychologist, licensed mental health professional, or counselor engaged in
- 8 <u>professional counseling; or</u>
- 9 <u>(3)</u> State, county, or municipal criminal justice employee or law enforcement officer.
