- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise certain provisions regarding required stops at
- 2 railroad crossings.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 32-29-4 be amended to read:
- 5 32-29-4. If any person driving a vehicle approaches a railroad grade crossing and a law
- 6 enforcement officer or a clearly visible or audible signal gives warning of the immediate
- 7 approach of a railway train or car <u>or other on-track equipment</u>, the driver shall bring such the
- 8 vehicle to a complete stop within fifty feet but not less than fifteen feet from the nearest rail of
- 9 such the railroad and may not proceed until the driver can do so safely. A violation of this
- 10 section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.
- 11 Section 2. That § 32-29-9 be amended to read:
- 12 32-29-9. Before making any crossing the person operating or moving any vehicle or



1 equipment described in § 32-29-8 shall give reasonable notice to the station agent of the railroad 2 owning the tracks of the intended crossing to allow the railroad to provide proper protection at 3 the crossing. Before making any crossing the person operating or moving the vehicle or 4 equipment shall first stop the vehicle or equipment not less than fifteen feet nor more than fifty 5 feet from the nearest rail of the railroad and while so stopping shall listen and look in both 6 directions along the track for any approaching railway train or car or other on-track equipment 7 and for signals indicating the approach of a railway train or car or other on-track equipment, and 8 may not proceed until the crossing can be made safely. No crossing may be made when warning 9 is given by automatic signal or crossing gates or a flagman or otherwise of the immediate 10 approach of a railroad railway train or car or other on-track equipment. If a flagman is provided 11 by the railroad, movement over the crossing shall be under his the flagman's direction. A 12 violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor.
