1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION, Inviting President Donald J. Trump to visit the State of
2 South Dakota, and most especially to visit Mount Rushmore Memorial and Crazy Horse
3 Memorial.

4 WHEREAS, many United States presidents have visited the great State of South Dakota and
5 especially the world famous Mount Rushmore; and

6 WHEREAS, President Calvin Coolidge, in 1927 helped dedicate the start of the presidential
7 carvings on the mountain, and President Franklin Roosevelt, in 1936 visited the mountain and
8 spoke at the dedication of the Jefferson head; and

9 WHEREAS, President George H.W. Bush visited Mount Rushmore in 1991 to speak at the
10 fiftieth anniversary of the conclusion of the carvings of the presidents; and

11 WHEREAS, the immense mountain carving of significant Native American leader, Crazy
12 Horse, is in close proximity to Mount Rushmore, and the Native American population has
13 played and continues to play an important role in the growth and development of the state:

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Ninety-Second Legislature



1 of the State of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the South
2 Dakota Legislature hereby invites President Donald J. Trump to visit the great State of South
3 Dakota and to spend time in the Black Hills viewing Mount Rushmore, America's shrine of
4 democracy, and the emerging carving of Crazy Horse; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the South Dakota Legislature hereby encourages
6 Governor Dennis Daugaard, United States Senator John Thune, United States Senator Mike
7 Rounds, United States Representative Kristi Noem and their staffs to promote such a visit and
8 to suggest that it would be particularly appropriate for the visit to take place on or near the
9 fourth of July.
