- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to eliminate the need to prove the use of force, fraud, or
- 2 coercion in the human trafficking of minors.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 22-49-1 be amended to read:
- 5 22-49-1. No person may recruit, harbor, transport, provide, receive, or obtain, by any means,
- 6 another person knowing that force, fraud, or coercion will be used to cause the person to engage
- 7 in prostitution, forced labor, or involuntary servitude. Nor may any person No person may
- 8 benefit financially or by receiving anything of value from participation in a venture that has
- 9 engaged in acts set forth in this section. Any violation of this section constitutes the crime of
- 10 human trafficking. If the victim is under eighteen years of age, the crime of human trafficking
- 11 need not involve force, fraud, or coercion.
