1	A RESOLUTION, Urging South Dakota's congressional representation to seek a federal disaster
2	declaration and to provide federal aid for counties and tribes in South Dakota suffering from
3	devastating effects created by Winter Storm Ulmer.
4	WHEREAS, Winter Storm Ulmer brought freezing rain and drizzle, snow, high winds, and
5	flooding, leading to blizzard conditions in many areas of South Dakota on March 13 to March 15,
6	2019; and
7	WHEREAS, dangerous road and weather conditions led to the closure of schools, state offices,
8	and many local government offices and caused interruptions in the normal course of mail delivery,
9	school, business, and farm work activities; and
10	WHEREAS, Governor Kristi Noem signed an executive order on March 15, 2019, declaring a
11	state emergency due to the extreme weather conditions in the State of South Dakota; and
12	WHEREAS, strong winds and rainfall caused damage to private homes and infrastructure damage,
13	including ongoing flooding; and

1 WHEREAS, the full impact of the damage to the state is yet to be realized and will continue to

- 2 significantly affect farmers, ranchers, and South Dakota's entire agriculture industry; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the Oglala Sioux Tribe's roads and water supply infrastructure were devastated,
- 4 leaving residents stranded and without drinking water, and South Dakota National Guard members
- 5 have been sent to provide drinking water and assist; and
- WHEREAS, the Rosebud Sioux Tribe is facing ongoing flooding and has opened dams and is
- 7 preparing for additional flooding; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the Cheyenne River Sioux Tribe officials have declared an emergency, and other
- 9 tribes in the state have suffered damage and face the threat of flooding; and
- WHEREAS, some residents have been evacuated, including by helicopter, and South Dakotans,
- livestock, infrastructure, and wildlife remain at risk in certain areas:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Ninety-Fourth Legislature of
- the State of South Dakota, that the South Dakota Legislature urges Representative Dusty Johnson and
- 14 Senators Michael Rounds and John Thune to work with Governor Kristi Noem, the United States
- 15 Congress, President Trump, and the Federal Emergency Management Agency to approve a
- 16 Presidential Major Disaster Declaration and to provide aid for counties and tribes in South Dakota
- suffering from devastating effects created by the Winter Storm Ulmer blizzard and the subsequent
- 18 flooding in its wake.
