

2020 South Dakota Legislature

House Bill 1006

Introduced by: **Representatives** Chaffee, Lesmeister, McCleerey, and Qualm and **Senators** Cammack, Kennedy, and Lake at the request of the Agricultural Land Assessment Implementation and Oversight Advisory Task Force

- An Act to authorize the secretary of revenue to contract with certain entities for purposes of maintaining a database to determine agricultural income value and to specify the mandatory and permissive data of the database.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- **Section 1.** That § 10-6-33.29 be AMENDED:

10-6-33.29. Agricultural income value--Determination--Database of cropland data.

The-In order to determine the agricultural income value of agricultural land by county, the secretary of revenue, with the consent of the Agricultural Land Assessment Implementation and Oversight Advisory Task Force, shall—enter into contracts annually contract with—South—Dakota—State—University—and, if necessary, the South—Dakota—Agricultural—Statistics Service—one or more qualified entities for the purpose of—creating maintaining—a database—to determine—the agricultural—income value of agricultural—land—by county, consisting of eight—consecutive years of cropland data and noncropland data. The data for the year representing the highest agricultural income value among the eight years and the year representing the lowest agricultural—income among the eight years shall be disregarded for valuation purposes. For each assessment year, the first year of the eight—year data period shall be the year that is nine years less than the assessment year.

The cropland data—may_must include÷ acres planted, acres harvested, yield per acre, and statewide crop prices. The noncropland data—may_must include÷ cash rents, rangeland acres, pastureland acres, and statewide cow and calf prices. The following noncropland data may also be included: rangeland—AUM's_animal_unit months per acre, pastureland—AUM's_animal_unit months per acre, and grazing season data, and statewide cow and calf prices.

The Agricultural Land Assessment Implementation and Oversight Advisory Task

Force may recommend other cropland and noncropland data to the Legislature for

subsequent use in the database. The secretary shall have such data collected for 2001, which will serve as the first year of the database, and each year thereafter. The database shall consist of the most recent eight years of data that have been collected and the two years, one year representing the highest agricultural income value and one year representing the lowest agricultural income value, shall be discarded from the database. The database for the 2010 assessment for taxes payable in 2011 shall consist of data from 2001 to 2008, inclusive, and the database for each assessment year thereafter shall be adjusted accordingly. South Dakota State University—Qualified entities contracting with the secretary of revenue under this section shall provide the data for each county to the secretary of revenue by June first of each year.

For purposes of this section, a qualified entity is a federal or state agency, instrumentality, institution of higher learning, and other federal or state authority with expertise in researching or evaluating land production capacity.
