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- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 3 **Section 1.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

4 23-3-18.3. Definitions.
5 Terms used in §§ 23-3-18.1 to 23-3-18.8, inclusive, mean:
6 (1) "Missing person," a person who has been reported as missing to a law enforcement
7 agency;
8 (2) "Missing persons clearinghouse," the repository established in § 23-3-18.5.

- 9 **Section 2.** That a NEW SECTION be added:
- 10 23-3-18.4. Missing persons clearinghouse--Establishment--Purpose.
- 11 The missing persons clearinghouse is hereby established within the Division of
- <u>Criminal Investigation. The Division of Criminal Investigation shall administer the</u>
 <u>clearinghouse as provided in § 23-3-18.5.</u>
- 14 The missing persons clearinghouse shall be used by all law enforcement agencies
- 15 <u>in the state as a central repository for information on missing persons. A law enforcement</u>
- 16 <u>agency shall provide information to the clearinghouse on a form prescribed by the Division</u>
- 17 <u>of Criminal Investigation.</u>
- 18 **Section 3.** That a NEW SECTION be added:
- 23-3-18.5. Missing persons clearinghouse--Administration--Requirements.
 To administer the missing persons clearinghouse, the Division of Criminal
 Investigation shall:
 (1) Collect, process, maintain, and disseminate information about missing persons in
 this state through a hard copy or an electronic means;

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1	<u>(2)</u>	Develop training programs for law enforcement agencies concerning the
2		appropriate procedures to report missing persons to the clearinghouse;
3	<u>(3)</u>	Cooperate with other states and the National Crime Information Center in the
4		exchange of information on missing persons;
5	<u>(4)</u>	Maintain an internet web site accessible to law enforcement agencies and to the
6		public with information on missing persons and with information about the
7		resources available through the clearinghouse. The web site may contain
8		information on missing persons including names, photographs, or other images, if
9		available; descriptions of missing persons; the law enforcement agencies or
10		persons to contact with information regarding missing persons; and the names of
11		persons reported missing whose locations have been determined and confirmed.
12		Nothing in this subdivision prevents the Division of Criminal Investigation from
13		establishing a separate link accessible only to law enforcement agencies for the
14		dissemination and collection of sensitive information as determined by the Division
15		of Criminal Investigation;
16	<u>(5)</u>	Maintain a registry of prevention and education materials and programs regarding
17		missing and runaway minors through hard copy or electronic means; and
18	(6)	Compile statistics relating to the incidence of missing persons within this state.

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2	23-3-18.8. Missing person locatedPurging of information.
3	After the location of a missing person is determined and confirmed, the
4	clearinghouse may only release information described in subdivision 23-3-18.5(4)
5	concerning the located person. Other information concerning the history of the missing
6	person case may only be disclosed to law enforcement agencies of this state and other
7	jurisdictions if necessary for the discharge of official duties, and to the juvenile court in
8	the county of residence of a located person who is a minor. Any information in the
9	<u>clearinghouse relating to a missing person who is an adult shall be purged when the</u>
10	person's location is determined and confirmed. All information in the clearinghouse
11	relating to a missing person who is a minor shall be purged when the person reaches
12	eighteen years of age and the person's location is determined and confirmed.
