## SENATE BILL NO. 138

- 1 FOR AN ACT ENTITLED, An Act to revise the qualifications for the director and employees
- of the Division of Veterans Affairs and for county veterans' service officers.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 Section 1. That § 33-16-8 be amended to read as follows:
- 5 33-16-8. The commissioners shall nominate a director, who shall be the executive head of
- 6 the Division of Veterans Affairs, and who. The director shall devote full time to the duties of
- 7 such the office and shall be appointed and serve pursuant to § 1-46-7. The director shall be a
- 8 citizen of the United States and of the State of South Dakota, and be an honorably discharged
- 9 wartime veteran. Any additional discharge or separation from the armed forces of the United
- 10 States held by the individual appointed as the director shall be honorable, regardless of the
- 11 period of service.
- Section 2. That § 33-16-13 be amended to read as follows:
- 13 33-16-13. All employees of the Division of Veterans Affairs below the level of director shall
- be selected as provided by chapter 3-6A. However, all employees shall be veterans, if available.
- 15 If the employees are veterans, all discharges or separations from the armed forces of the United

1 States held by the employees shall be honorable. These employees shall perform duties assigned

- 2 to them by the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs.
- 3 Section 3. That § 33-16-27 be amended to read as follows:
- 4 33-16-27. The county veterans' service officer shall be a veteran who has served in the
- 5 armed forces of the United States, as that term is defined by § 33-17-1. Any discharge or
- 6 separation from the armed forces of the United States held by the individual appointed as the
- 7 county veterans' service officer shall be honorable, regardless of the period of service. However,
- 8 any person who was qualified and held this position on July 1, 1989 may continue in such
- 9 office.
