

2020 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1069

1An Act to authorize certain veterans to attend courses offered at postsecondary2technical institutes without payment of tuition.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 Section 1. That § 13-55-2 be AMENDED:

13-55-2. Veterans entitled to free tuition at state institutions--Period of entitlement.

7 Any person residing in this state who is a veteran as defined by \S 33A-2-1 and 8 33A-2-2 or who performed active war service, such as nursing or assisting in the care of 9 soldiers and sailors in any government hospital, field, or camp, as a member of the Red 10 Cross or any other similar organization engaged in war relief work which has been recognized and approved by the government of the United States, during any of the 11 12 periods or combat operations specified in § 33A-2-2, upon compliance with all the 13 requirements for admission and after qualifying for resident tuition, may attend and 14 pursue any undergraduate course in any state educational institution under the control 15 and management of the Board of Regents or any course at a postsecondary technical 16 institute as defined in § 13-39A-1 without the payment of charges for tuition for each 17 month of qualified service or major fraction thereof a month in academic time. However, 18 no eligible veteran is entitled to less than one nor more than four academic years of free 19 tuition pursuant to this section. Residence at the time of entry into military service or 20 active war service does not affect eligibility for the entitlement created in this section. Any 21 person who qualifies under § 33A-2-2 as a veteran based solely on a service-connected 22 disability may receive free tuition under this section only if the veterans administration 23 disability rating is ten percent or greater.

24 <u>No tuition benefit may be provided by the state under this section until the</u> 25 <u>applicant has applied all federal tuition benefits. Before receiving funds from the state for</u> 26 the tuition of any eligible applicant under this section, the Board of Regents or

postsecondary technical institute shall verify that all federal tuition benefits have been <u>exhausted.</u>
