## 1 A LEGISLATIVE COMMEMORATION, Commending the nation of Israel for its cordial 2 and mutually beneficial relationship with the United States and with the State 3 of South Dakota.

4	WHEREAS, Israel has been granted her lands under and through the oldest
5	recorded deed, as recorded in the Old Testament scriptures held sacred and revered by
6	Jews and Christians alike, as presenting the acts and words of God; and
7	WHEREAS, the claim and presence of the Jewish people in Israel has remained
8	constant throughout the past four thousand years of history; and
9	WHEREAS, the legal basis for the establishment of the modern state of Israel was
10	a binding resolution under international law, which was unanimously adopted by the
11	League of Nations in 1922 and subsequently affirmed by both houses of the United States
12	Congress; and
13	WHEREAS, this resolution affirmed the establishment of a national home for the
14	Jewish people in the historical region of the land of Israel, including the areas of Judea,
15	Samaria, and Jerusalem; and
16	WHEREAS, Article 80 of the United Nations Charter 22 recognized the continued
17	validity of the rights granted to states or peoples which already existed under international
18	instruments, and therefore the 1922 League of Nations resolution remains valid, and the
19	six hundred fifty thousand Jews currently residing in the areas of Judea, Samaria, and
20	eastern Jerusalem reside there legitimately; and
21	WHEREAS, Israel declared its independence and self-governance on May 14, 1948,
22	with the goal of re-establishing its God-given and legally recognized lands as a homeland
23	for the Jewish people; and
24	WHEREAS, the United States, having been the first country to recognize Israel as
25	an independent nation and as Israel's principal ally, has enjoyed a close and mutually
26	beneficial relationship with Israel and her people: and

1	WHEREAS, there are increasing incidents of anti-Semitism around the world,
2	including across the United States reflected in official hate crime statistics; and
3	WHEREAS, the international boycott, divestment, and sanctions movement is one
4	of the main vehicles for spreading anti-Semitism and advocating the elimination of the
5	Jewish State; and
6	WHEREAS, the dramatic increase in boycott, divestment, and sanctions campaign
7	activities on college campuses around the country has resulted in increased animosity and
8	intimidation against Jewish students, negatively impacting student programming related
9	to the State of Israel and politics in the Middle East; and
10	WHEREAS, leaders of the boycott, divestment, and sanctions movement say their
11	goal is to eliminate Israel as the home of the Jewish people; and
12	WHEREAS, messaging at anti-Israel rallies has adopted the boycott, divestment,
13	and sanctions slogan: "from the river to the sea Palestine will be free" which means that
14	there would be no Israel between the Jordan River and the Mediterranean Sea and that
15	the State of Israel will cease to exist; and
16	WHEREAS, Israel is the greatest friend and ally of the United States in the Middle
17	East and the values of our two nations are so intertwined that it is impossible to separate
18	one from the other; and
19	WHEREAS, there are those in the Middle East who have continually sought to
20	destroy Israel, from the time of its inception as a state, and those same enemies of Israel
21	also hate, and seek to destroy, the United States; and
22	WHEREAS, the promise of the God of Israel, who is the God stated in our
23	Constitution, is that He will bless those who bless Israel, and be it known that the State
24	of South Dakota openly blesses Israel with gratitude for our cordial and mutually beneficial
25	relations since 1948, a friendship that continues to strengthen with each passing year:
26	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT COMMEMORATED, by the Ninety-Fifth Legislature of the
27	State of South Dakota, that the Legislature commends Israel for its cordial and mutually
28	beneficial relationship with the United States and with the State of South Dakota, supports
29	Israel in its legal, historical, moral, and God-given right of self-governance and self-
30	defense upon the entirety of its own lands, and recognizes that Israel is neither an
31	attacking force nor an occupier of the lands of others, and that peace can be afforded the
32	region only through a whole and united Israel.
