

## 2020 South Dakota Legislature Senate Bill 62

## 1An Act to revise the membership and responsibilities of the South Dakota Board on2Geographic Names.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 **Section 1.** That § 1-19C-2.1 be AMENDED:

5 **1-19C-2.1. South Dakota Board on Geographic Names created--Members--**6 **Meetings--Investigations--Promulgation of rules.** 

7 The South Dakota Board on Geographic Names is hereby created. The board 8 consists of the secretary of tribal relations and one representative each from the 9 Department of Tribal Relations, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources, 10 the Department of Transportation, the State Historical Society, and the Department of 11 Tourism. The board shall elect a chair and vice chair from among its membership and shall 12 meet at least once each year to consider issues related to geographical place names and 13 to make recommendations to the appropriate local, state, and federal agencies. The board shall investigate any proposed names, solicit public input, and make a recommendation 14 15 to the United States Board on Geographic Names as to whether the board supports a new 16 or replacement name. The board may establish procedures and standards to recommend, 17 evaluate, and select geographic place names by rules promulgated pursuant to chapter 1-18 26. The rules shall be compatible with the standards of the United States Board on 19 Geographic Names as contained in its manual, Principles, Policies and Procedures: 20 Domestic Names, Reston, Virginia, 1997. 22 **Section 2.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

1-19C-2.3. Unnamed geographic place--Public meetings.
Notwithstanding the provisions of § 1-19C-2.2, if a geographic place has not
previously been named and the naming of that unnamed geographic place is requested,

- 2 <u>and determine whether to recommend an original name for that geographic place to the</u>
- 3 <u>United States Board on Geographic Names.</u>
