2 MR. PRESIDENT:

3 The Committee on Senate State Affairs respectfully reports that it has had under consideration
4 **SB 45** and returns the same with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

5 45A

6 On page 1, line 22, of the Introduced bill, after "program," delete "the value-added agriculture
7 subfund, "

8 On page 1, lines 24 through 2, after "Authority." insert " The Board of Economic Development
9 is substituted for the Value Added Finance Authority and succeeds to the rights, privileges, and
10 duties, and leases, indentures, accounts, and other documents or transactions relating to the value-
11 added agriculture subfund."

12 On page 13, lines 18 through 25, after the end of the last paragraph delete "Section 22. That
13 a NEW SECTION be added:

14 Authority contracts--Payment or interest rate risks for bonds.

15 The authority may enter into any contract that the authority determines necessary or
16 appropriate to manage payment or interest rate risk for bonds issued pursuant to this chapter, the
17 investment of proceeds, or other funds of the authority. The contracts may include: interest rate
18 exchange agreements; contracts providing for payment or receipt of funds based on levels of or
19 changes in interest rates; contracts to exchange cash flows or series of payments; or contracts
20 incorporating interest rate caps, collars, floors, or locks."

21 And that as so amended, said bill do pass.

22 Also MR. PRESIDENT:

23 The Committee on Senate State Affairs respectfully reports that it has had under consideration
24 **SB 62** and returns the same with the recommendation that said bill do pass, and having been
25 certified as uncontested, be placed on the consent calendar.
