Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added:

1-1-29. Daylight savings time.

The State of South Dakota is in permanent daylight savings time pursuant to the provisions of 15 U.S.C. § 260a. This section may not be construed to affect the standard time established under federal law governing the movements of common carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for performance of an act by an officer or department of the United States, as established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or regulation of the United States or any agency of the United States.
