

2020 South Dakota Legislature Senate Bill 88

1An Act to require parental notification of self-injurious behavior expressed during2counseling sessions.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

4 **Section 1.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

5	13-33A-12. Counseling servicesParental notificationRequirement.
6	If a counselor, school psychologist, or social worker, employed by a school district
7	or nonpublic school in this state, determines during a counseling session that a student
8	under the age of eighteen is articulating feelings of gender dysphoria, or determines that
9	a student under the age of eighteen is articulating an interest in self-injurious behavior,
10	the counselor, psychologist, or social worker shall provide notice of the determination to
11	a parent of the student.
12	Section 2. That § 19-19-508.1 be AMENDED:

19-19-508.1. Student and counselor, psychologist, or social worker--13 14 **Exceptions.** 15 No counselor or school psychologist, certificated in accordance with the certification 16 regulations of the South Dakota Board of Education Standards, or social worker licensed 17 under chapter 36-26 and regularly employed as a Except as otherwise required in § 13-18 33A-12 or permitted in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 19 U.S.C. § 1232g, no counselor, school psychologist, or social worker-for a private or public 20 elementary or secondary school or school system in the State of South Dakota, employed 21 by a school district or nonpublic school in this state, may divulge to any other person, or 22 be examined concerning any information or communication given to the counselor, school 23 psychologist, or social worker in the counselor's, school psychologist's, or social worker's 24 official capacity by a student unless:

25 (1) This privilege is waived in writing by the student; or

- 1 (2) The information or communication was made to the counselor, school psychologist, 2 or social worker for the express purpose of being communicated or of-being made 3 public; or
- 4 (3) The counselor, school psychologist, or social worker has reason to suspect, as a
 5 result of that information or communication, that the student or some other persons
 6 have person has been subjected to child abuse or that the student's physical or
 7 mental health or the physical or mental health of other persons another person may
 8 be in jeopardy.
