- An Act to require a feasibility study and actuarial analysis on long-term care services and supports.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 4 **Section 1.** The Department of Labor and Regulation shall contract for an independent
- 5 feasibility study and actuarial model of public, private, and public-private hybrid options to
- 6 <u>help persons prepare for, access, and afford the long-term care services and supports they</u>
- 7 <u>need. The study shall include a report of findings and a model for all of the following:</u>
- 8 (1) An affordable annual long-term care benefit available to all who meet the minimum
 9 eligibility of needing assistance with two activities of daily living, with the maximum
 10 benefit amount to be determined by an actuarial analysis;
- 15 (3) A long-term care benefit paid for and open to those who are not currently eligible
 16 for the state Medicaid program
- 17 **Section 2.** The report required under this Act shall include all of the following:
- 18 (1) An analysis of public and private long-term care programs that exist in the state,
 19 the participation rates for those programs, and any clear gap that exists, including
 20 gaps in coverage, affordability, and participation;
- 21 (2) The expected cost and benefits for participants in a new long-term care benefit 22 program;
- 23 (3) The total anticipated number of participants;
- 24 (4) The impact on the current workforce;

- 1 (5) A recruitment and retention plan to meet anticipated shortages in the workforce
 2 due to the increasing aging population;
- 3 (6) The projected savings to the state Medicaid program, if any; and
- 4 (7) Any legal and financial risks to the state.
- 5 **Section 3.** The feasibility study and accompanying actuarial analysis required under this Act
- 6 <u>shall be completed and submitted to the Legislature and made available on the Department</u>
- 7 of Labor and Regulation's website no later than December 15, 2020.
