

2020 South Dakota Legislature House Bill 1176

1 An Act to authorize the consumption of alcohol in certain common areas.

- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 3 Section 1. That a NEW SECTION be added:

4	35-4-131. Sale or consumption in area abutting licensed premises.
5	Notwithstanding §§ 35-2-6.3, 35-4-75, and 35-4-114, an on-sale licensee may sell
6	malt beverages and wine to be consumed in a common area if the licensee has submitted
7	an affidavit to the department, and any local governing body that approved the on-sale
8	license, that is signed by the licensee and the person who owns the common area. The
9	licensee shall state in the affidavit:
10	(1) The licensee has permission to serve alcohol for consumption in the common area;
11	(2) A description of the dimensions of the common area where malt beverages and
12	wine may be consumed; and
13	(3) Any other limitation on the consumption of alcohol imposed by the common area
14	owner.
15	Before serving alcohol in common areas, the licensee shall also obtain approval
16	from any local governing body that approved the on-sale license. However, a request
17	under this section to serve alcohol in common areas shall not be considered a new retail
18	license nor warrant the reconsideration of any current license the licensee may have.
19	For purposes of this section, the term, common area, means property that is
20	indoors, owned by a person who leases the premises where the licensee conducts
21	business, and used in common by the customers of multiple businesses leased by the
22	same owner. If sale and consumption is authorized under this section, the common area
23	is not a public place for purposes of § 35-1-5.3.
24	Malt beverages and wine may only be consumed in a common area during the
25	hours that consumption is permitted on the on-sale licensee's premises.

A violation of this title by a licensee who serves a malt beverage or wine consumed
in the common area in accordance with this section is a violation of this title as if the
violation had occurred on the licensed premises.
