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- 2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:
- 3 **Section 1.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

4	9-24-7. Maximum liabilityMunicipal airportAccidents or occurrences.			
5	The maximum liability of any municipality operating an airport shall be five million			
6	dollars for any accident or occurrence at or in connection with the operation of the airport			
7	resulting in bodily injury or death to any person, or damage to property, or any			
8	combination thereof.			
9	Section 2. That § 50-1-1 be AMENDED:			
10	50-1-1. Definitions.			
11	Terms as used in this title mean:			
12	(1) "Aeronautics," the science, art, and physics of flight. The term also means the			
13	method or act of construction, repair, or maintenance of airports, airport facilities,			
14	aircraft, and aviation facilities;			
15	(2)—"Air traffic control," a service operated by an authority under Federal Aviation			
16	Administration oversight to promote the safe, orderly, and expeditious flow of air			
17	traffic in the United States;			
18	(3)(2) "Aircraft," a device that is used, intended to be used, or designed for flight in the			
19	air. The term includes any airplane, balloon, civil aircraft, drone, glider, <u>and</u>			
20	helicopter , and public aircraft ;			
21	(4)(3) "Aircraft dealer," any person, manufacturer, or distributor engaged in the business			
22	of buying, selling, exchanging, or acting as a broker for three or more aircraft in			
23	any twelve consecutive months, other than a business liquidation of used aircraft;			
24	(5)(4) "Airport," any area of land or water used, or intended to be used, for landing and			

25 take-off of aircraft, and any appurtenant area, structure, facility, or right of way to

1 facilitate that use. The term includes any military airport, private airport, public 2 airport, and temporary airport; 3 (6)(5) "Airport authority," any regional airport authority a government entity created under this chapter for the purpose of acquiring, establishing, contracting, 4 5 maintaining, improving and operating airports and other navigation facilities; (7)(6) "Airport facility," any property, structure, mechanism, machinery, light, beacon, 6 7 marker, communicating system, or other instrumentality equipment or device used 8 as an aid to the safe taking off and landing of aircraft, or the safe and efficient 9 operation or maintenance of an airport, and which is not owned or operated by the 10 federal government; (8)(7) "Airport hazard," any existing or potential condition that can endanger the life or 11 12 property of a user of an airport, any airport facility, or any occupant of land in the 13 vicinity of an airport, and which can lead to damage to or loss of airport system 14 equipment or property or the environment; 15 (9) "Airport obstruction," any structure or obstacle, or use of land, that obstructs an 16 aerial approach of an airport or is otherwise hazardous to the use of an airport by 17 aircraft for landing or taking off; "Airport sponsor," a public agency, private owner, state entity, or other 18 (10)(8) 19 political subdivision that is associated with a public use airport facility and is a 20 recipient of any federal airport improvement grant; 21 "Anemometer tower," a structure, including any guy wire or accessory facility, (11)(9) 22 on which an anemometer is mounted; 23 "Aviation facility," any airport facility that supports aviation activities, (12)(10)24 including any airport, heliport, and navigational aid; 25 "Balloon," an aircraft that is not engine-driven, is lighter than air, and (13)(11) 26 sustains flight through the use of gas buoyancy or an airborne heater; 27 (14) "Civil aircraft," any aircraft other than a public aircraft; 28 "Commercial purpose," an aviation activity for profit that includes flight (15)(12)29 instruction, charter, air taxi, or rental, but does not include the substitution of a 30 commercial use stamp for regular aircraft registration for the promotion of a 31 business or other purpose that does not involve aviation; 32 (16)(13) "Commission," the South Dakota Aeronautics Commission; "Controlled airspace," any airspace of specific and defined classifications and 33 (17)(14)dimensions inside of which air traffic control services are provided; 34 35 (18)(15) "Department," the Department of Transportation;

9	and	used in the interest of the public for those purposes;				
10	(22)<u>(19)</u>	"Navigational aid," any device an aviation facility which is external to an				
11	aircraft specifically intended to assist a pilot in determining the aircraft's position					
12	and	safe course;				
13	<u>(20)</u> "Obs	truction," any structure or obstacle, or use of land, that obstructs an aerial				
14	appr	oach of an airport or is otherwise hazardous to the use of an airport by aircraft				
15	<u>for la</u>	anding or taking off;				
16	(23)<u>(21)</u>	"Place of business," a permanent enclosed structure at which a permanent				
17	busir	ness of bartering, trading, or selling aircraft is carried out in good faith. The				
18	term	does not include any residence, tent, stand, or any other temporary structure;				
19	(24)<u>(22)</u>	"Prescribed adjusted height," a height adjusted upward seventeen feet for an				
20	inter	state highway, fifteen feet for any other public road, ten feet or the height of				
21	the	highest mobile object that would normally traverse the road, whichever is				
22	grea	ter, for a private road, and twenty-three feet for a railroad;				
23	(25)<u>(23)</u>	"Private airport," any privately owned privately-owned airport that is				
24	avail	able for use only by the owner and the owner's invitees;				
25	(26) "Proj	ect," any airport operated by an authority, including any real and personal				
26	prop	erty, structure, machinery, equipment, or appurtenance or facility that is part				
27	of th	e airport or used in connection with the airport either as a ground facility for				
28	the c	convenience of handling aviation equipment, passengers, or freight, or as part				
29	of ar	y aviation or air safety operation;				
30	(27) "Pub	lic aircraft," any aircraft, including military aircraft, used exclusively in the				
31	gove	rnmental service of any state or territory of the United States;				
32	(28)<u>(</u>24)	"Public airport," any airport, whether publicly or privately owned, that is				
33	avail	able to the public for aviation activity use by the public;				

1	(25) "Small unmanned aircraft," a UA that weighs not more than fifty-five pounds,					
2	(twenty-five kilograms) including everything that is onboard or otherwise attached					
3	to the aircraft;					
4	(29)(26) "Small unmanned aircraft system" or "sUAS," any <u>small unmanned aircraft</u>					
5	and its associated elements that is operated without the possibility of direct human					
6	intervention from within or on the aircraft, and that weighs not more than fifty-five					
7	pounds, including anything that is onboard or otherwise attached to the aircraft					
8	including communication links and the components that control the UA that are					
9	required for the safe and efficient operation of the UA;					
10	(30)(27) "Temporary airport," any airport established and set aside for the operation					
11	of aircraft for transitory or impermanent purposes;					
12	(28) "Unmanned aircraft" or "UA," an aircraft operated without the possibility of direct					
13	human intervention from within or on the aircraft.					
14	Section 3. That § 50-2-12 be AMENDED:					
15	50-2-12. Expenditures and disbursementsApprovalPurposes.					
16	The commission shall approve the expenditure and disbursement of grants or funds					
17	appropriated and available for matching purposes, and for the planning, construction,					
18	development, operation, and maintenance of airport facilities. The commission may also					
19	approve expenditures from the state aeronautics fund to support the advancement of					
20	aviation and aviation commerce within the state.					
21	Section 4. That a NEW SECTION be added:					
22	50-2-32. Commission actionAppeal.					
23	A person may appeal an action of the commission in accordance with chapter 1-					
24	<u>26.</u>					
25	Section 5. That § 50-4-12 be AMENDED:					
26	50-4-12. Sale of aircraft fuelReportViolation as misdemeanor.					
27	Each person engaged in selling aircraft fuel to retailers or consumers at wholesale,					
28	shall, on or before the fifteenth day of each month, file a sworn statement and report with					
29	the department, upon forms prescribed and provided by the commission provided by the					
30	department, showing the number of gallons of aircraft fuel sold in South Dakota for use					
31	in aircraft. Any person failing to file such report is guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.					

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Section 6. That § 50-4-13 be AMENDED: 50-4-13. Aircraft fuel tax revenues--Appropriation and use. All of the <u>The</u> aircraft fuel tax collected on aircraft fuel purchased, imported,

All of the <u>The</u> aircraft fuel tax collected on aircraft fuel purchased, imported, received, or distributed for subsequent sale for use in aircraft shall be appropriated and used as provided in § 50-4-14.

6 **Section 7.** That § 50-7-2 be AMENDED:

50-7-2. County commissioners and municipalities--Airports--Powers and jurisdiction--Airport boards.

9 The board of county commissioners of any county in this state may acquire, 10 establish, construct, own, control, lease, equip, improve, maintain, operate, and regulate 11 airports for the use of aircraft within the limits of the county, and may use for any such 12 purpose any real property suitable therefor owned or controlled by the county. Each 13 municipality has the same power and jurisdiction except that a municipality may exercise 14 the power either within or without the corporate limits of the municipality. Any municipality 15 situated at or near the boundary line of an adjoining state may exercise the power and 16 jurisdiction over real property and persons, for such purposes in the adjoining state and 17 may maintain actions in the corporate name in the courts of the adjoining state for the 18 exercise or protection of any rights authorized by this chapter. The governing boards of a 19 county or a municipality may by resolution create an airport board by resolution.

20 Section 8. That § 50-7-7 be AMENDED:

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50-7-7. Statement of intention to establish airport--Protest by voters--Submission to vote.

23 If the question of establishing a county airport has not previously been approved 24 by a majority vote of the voters at an election at which the question was submitted, then 25 any county desiring to establish and construct an airport shall state in the next published 26 report of the county's proceedings the county's intention to establish and construct the 27 airport stating the maximum amount which might be required to do so. If within sixty 28 days from the publication a protest signed by fifteen percent of the voters of the county 29 voting for Governor at the last general election for Governor be filed with the county 30 commissioners, then no action may be taken until the question has been submitted to a 31 vote of the people and sixty percent of those voting shall vote in favor thereof. The

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question to be so submitted shall be, "Shall the county expend an amount not to exceed
 \$_______ to establish and construct an airport?"

3 Section 9. That § 50-7-10 be AMENDED:

50-7-10. Airport sponsors--Powers--Federal grants--Agreements.

5 The airport sponsor shall-may designate the department as the airport sponsor's 6 agent to accept, receive, and receipt for federal grants in the body's behalf for airport 7 purposes, and to contract for the planning, construction, and maintenance of aviation 8 facilities. The airport sponsor may enter into an agreement with the department 9 prescribing the terms and conditions of the agency under this section. The federal grants 10 shall be paid to the airport sponsor under the terms and conditions imposed by the United 11 States government in making the grant.

12 **Section 10.** That § 50-7-15 be AMENDED:

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50-7-15. Cooperative agreements--Airport improvements--Reimbursement.

14 The department, on behalf of the commission, may enter into cooperative 15 agreements with the governing body of a governmental agency, whereby, the initial 16 expenditures for making authorized airport improvements may be paid from any state 17 aeronautics fund moneys that may be available to the commission and the governmental 18 agency's share of the expenditure may be reimbursed to the commission over a period of 19 three years. The reimbursements shall be paid into the special aviation internal service 20 fund created by § 50-2-16 state aeronautics fund and used for airport improvement 21 purposes, or shall be paid into the specific fund used to make the initial expenditures. Any 22 governmental agency may enter into a cooperative financing agreement upon the 23 adoption of a resolution authorizing the governing body to enter into the agreement.

24 **Section 11.** That § 50-7-17 be AMENDED:

25 50-7-17. Airport system expansion and improvement--Project applications- 26 Prior approval--Federal funds--Requirements.

27 No governmental agency in this state, whether acting alone or jointly with another 28 governmental agency, may submit to the administrator of the federal aviation 29 administration Federal Aviation Administration any project application under the 30 provisions of any act of Congress which provides airport planning, construction, and 31 development funds or other funds for the expansion and improvement of the airport

1 system as such the act shall pertain to the State of South Dakota, unless the project 2 application has been first approved by the department. No governmental agency may 3 directly receive or disburse any funds granted by the United States under such the act, 4 but the governmental agency shall designate the department as its agent to receive and 5 disburse the funds. The governmental agency shall enter into an agreement with the 6 department prescribing the terms and conditions of the agency in accordance with federal 7 laws and regulations and applicable laws of this state. The moneys paid over by the United 8 States government shall be retained by the state or paid over to the governmental agency 9 under such terms and conditions as may be imposed by the United States government 10 making the grant.

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Section 12. That § 50-7-18 be AMENDED:

50-7-18. Indemnification agreements--Lands subject to mineral rights or oil and gas leases.

14 The department may in cases where federal funds are channeled through the 15 department, pursuant to the provisions of § 50-7-17, enter into contracts and agreements 16 binding on this state with the administrator of the federal aviation administration Federal 17 Aviation Administration to indemnify the United States for federal funds contributed to the 18 State of South Dakota, or any governmental agency, used for the purchase of land as the 19 site of a public airport or for the construction of airport improvements on the airport within 20 this state where the title to the land is subject to mineral rights or oil and gas leases, the 21 release or subordination of which is determined by the administrator of the federal aviation 22 administration Federal Aviation Administration not to be practicable.

23 Section 13. That § 50-7-19 be AMENDED:

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The indemnifying agreements authorized in §§ 50-7-17 and 50-7-18 are limited:

(1) To agreements which obligate the department, acting for and on behalf of the State
 of South Dakota, to refund to the United States of America as represented by the
 administrator of the federal aviation administration Federal Aviation Administration,
 a sum equal to the full amount of federal funds contributed for the purchase of land
 or construction of airport improvements thereon; or

50-7-19. Indemnification agreements--Limitations.

At the option of the administrator, to provide and construct at state expense and
 without further contributions by the federal government, an airport facility
 equivalent to that developed with the aid of federal funds and located as near as

practicable to the site of the existing facilities on land with good title satisfactory to
 the administrator of the federal aviation administration Federal Aviation
 <u>Administration</u> as prescribed by the provisions of section 9 of the Federal Airport
 Act (Public Law 377, 79th Congress, 2nd session as amended to January 1, 2014).

- 5 **Section 14.** That a NEW SECTION be added:
- 50-9-14. Airport hazard--Public nuisance--Prevention.
 The creation or establishment of an airport hazard is a public nuisance and an
 injury to the community or the United States served by the airport and shall be prevented
 in accordance with this title.
- 10 **Section 15.** That a NEW SECTION be added:

50-9-15. Removal of airport hazards--Public purpose--Public funds.
 The prevention of the creation or establishment of airport hazards and the
 elimination, removal, alteration, mitigation, or marking and lighting of existing airport
 hazards are public purposes for which the political subdivisions may raise and expend
 public funds and acquire land or a property interest.

16 **Section 16.** That § 50-10-6 be AMENDED:

50-10-6. Airport layout--Zones--Permitted land uses--Runway protection zone--Exclusions.

19 The regulations required by § 50-10-5 shall divide the airport layout into zones, 20 and, within each zone, specify the land uses permitted, regulate and restrict the height to 21 which structures and trees obstructions may be erected or allowed to grow, prohibit the 22 obstruction by lights, smoke, electronic devices, or any other means, of the safe operation 23 of aircraft near airports, and impose other restrictions and requirements as may be 24 necessary for the protection of the airport. The existing and ultimate runway protection 25 zone as depicted on the airport layout plan shall be zoned to exclude homes and structures 26 that constitute a concentration of people.

27 **Section 17.** That § 50-10-9 be AMENDED:

28 **50-10-9. Regulations--Limitations.**

29 No airport zoning regulation adopted under this chapter may be unreasonable. No 30 regulation may require the removal, lowering, or other change or alteration of any

2	or otherwise interfere with the continuance of any nonconforming use, except as provided			
3	in § 50-10-28.			
4	Section 18. That § 50-11-21 be AMENDED:			
5	50-11-21. Promulgation of rulesAdditional registration taxAeronautics			
6	fund.			
7	The commission may prescribe forms and promulgate rules pursuant to chapter 1-			
8	26 for the ascertainment, assessment, collection, or return of the additional original			
9	registration tax imposed by § 50-11-19. Upon receipt of the original registration tax, the			
10	department shall pay it to the state treasurer to be credited to the aeronautics fund.			
11	Section 19. That § 50-11-33 be AMENDED:			
12	50-11-33. Certificate of registrationPermitsAlteration or forgery			
13	Violation as felony.			
14	A person is guilty of a Class 5 felony if the <u>A No</u> person alters, forges <u>may</u> :			
15	(1) Alter, forge, or causes cause to be altered or forged, a certificate of registration or			
16	permit issued under this chapter , or<u>;</u>

22	Section 20. That § 50-12-2 be AMENDED:			
23	50-12-2. Aircraft dealer's licenseApplicationContents.			
24	Any person desiring to sell or solicit as a dealer the sale of aircraft within South			
25	Dakota shall apply for an aircraft dealer's license to the department. For the original			
26	application, the person shall possess one or more aircraft under normal registration. The

- 29 (1) The name and physical address of the aircraft dealer;
- 30 (2) The physical address of each owner, director, or principal officer of such aircraft
 31 dealer. If the applicant is a foreign corporation, the application shall designate the

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50-12-14. Dealer's license--Renewal--Requirements--Appeal--Fees.

12 Each licensed dealer on or before February first of the second year shall-make 13 application apply for the renewal of the dealer's license. The dealer shall verify having sold 14 or brokered at least six aircraft within the past twenty-four calendar months. However, 15 any dealer not meeting the requirements of this section may appeal to the commission 16 for renewal of a dealer's license if the dealer can demonstrate reasonable cause for not 17 meeting those requirements. The fee for the renewal of a license is the same as that 18 required for an original license. Upon failure to make application apply for the renewal of 19 the license, and to pay the renewal fee on or before the first day of February of the second 20 year, an additional fee of ten dollars per month, or any fraction thereof, is required before 21 the license shall be issued.

A former dealer may make an application for an original aircraft dealer's license after thirty-six months from the expiration date of the dealer's license.

26 Considerations.

It is a Class 1 misdemeanor for any person to operate an aircraft in the air or on the ground or water in a careless or reckless manner so as to endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property. In any proceeding for a violation of this section, the court in determining whether the operation was careless or reckless shall consider the standards for safe operation of aircraft prescribed by federal statutes-or, regulations, or <u>advisories</u> governing aeronautics.
