38 WHEREAS, in 2002, Congress amended the Agricultural Marketing Act of 1946 to require that
39 retailers notify customers purchasing covered commodities, including beef and pork, of the
40 commodities' origin, by means of a "Country of Origin Label" (COOL); and

1 WHEREAS, the COOL requirements were not applicable to restaurants, cafeterias, or processed
2 foods; and

3 WHEREAS, the COOL requirements were designed to provide retailers with flexible labeling
4 options that included bands, placards, pin tags, signs, stickers, and twist ties, for conveying the
5 information in a legible form and in a conspicuous manner; and

6 WHEREAS, in May 2015, based on complaints from Canada and Mexico, the World Trade
7 Organization determined that COOL violated United States trade obligations and threatened to
8 impose retaliatory duties of \$1.1 billion, unless this country removed the requirement that covered
9 commodities, including beef and pork, be sold with a COOL; and

10 WHEREAS, in December 2015, Congress removed mandatory COOL requirements for muscle
11 cut beef and pork, and for ground beef and pork; and

12 WHEREAS, the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement ultimately did not include COOL;

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the Ninety-Fifth Legislature of the State
14 of South Dakota, the House of Representatives concurring therein, that the Legislature urgently
15 requests the President of the United States and the United States Trade Representative to negotiate
16 and execute agreements, with Canada and Mexico, which will remove trade barriers to COOL; and

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the secretary of the Senate transmit copies of this resolution
18 to the President of the United States, the speaker and clerk of the United States House of
19 Representatives, the president pro tempore and secretary of the United States Senate, and to the
20 members of the South Dakota Congressional delegation.
