Senate Bill 150

1 **An Act to revise nonresident waterfowl licensure.**

2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF SOUTH DAKOTA:

3 **Section 1.** That § 41-6-18.1 be AMENDED:

4 **41-6-18.1. Nonresident waterfowl license--Duration--Penalty—Promulgation**
5 **of rules.**

6 It is a Class 2 misdemeanor for a nonresident to hunt, take, or kill migratory
7 waterfowl without a nonresident waterfowl license ~~or a temporary nonresident waterfowl~~
8 ~~license~~, a migratory bird certification permit, and a federal migratory bird stamp, ~~or~~. It is
9 a Class 2 misdemeanor for a nonresident to be in violation of the conditions of the licenses
10 or the rules of the Game, Fish and Parks Commission.

11 A nonresident waterfowl license, ~~except as otherwise provided in this title,~~ entitles the
12 licensee to hunt migratory waterfowl for ~~ten~~ two periods of five consecutive days.

13 ~~Four dollars received from the sale of each nonresident waterfowl license shall be~~
14 ~~placed in the land acquisition and development fund. The moneys from this fund shall be~~
15 ~~used to acquire by purchase or lease real property to be used primarily for game~~
16 ~~production. This license shall be in such form as the Game, Fish and Parks Commission~~
17 ~~shall prescribe.~~

18 ~~The provision in this section limiting the validity of a nonresident waterfowl license to~~
19 ~~ten days does not apply in Union, Clay, Bon Homme, Yankton, and Charles Mix counties;~~
20 ~~and in such counties, the nonresident waterfowl license is valid during the same period as~~
21 ~~is a resident waterfowl license.~~

22 The commission may promulgate rules, in accordance with chapter 1-26, to divide the
23 state into no more than three units and to establish limitations on the number of
24 nonresident waterfowl licenses that are available. ~~If the Game, Fish and Parks~~
25 ~~Commission~~ commission allocates more than ~~four~~ six thousand nonresident waterfowl

1 licenses in a calendar year, any increase in the number of licenses allocated may not
2 exceed five percent of the number of licenses allocated in the previous calendar year.

3 **Section 2.** That §§ 41-6-18.2 and 41-6-18.4 be REPEALED.
